## Supportive Housing: Decoupling Housing and Services

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- What is supportive housing?
  - Affordable housing
  - Individualized housing
  - Community integrated
  - Individual choice and control



- "Bundled" model = housing and supports tied together
  - □ To live in a certain setting, must accept:
    - What services are offered
    - Who offers them



- Supportive housing = housing and supports both necessary, but not tied together
  - Choose housing setting
  - Choose supports needed to live there
  - Choose who offers them



- Affordable = Housing accessible to people at their income level
  - Subsidized with a voucher
  - Affordable housing project
  - Shared with roommates/friends to defray costs



- Individualized Supports
  - Assistance with daily living
  - Employment
  - All supports that help someone live independently in the community



- Community Integration
  - Access to employment opportunities, social opportunities, amenities and transportation
  - Opportunity for people with and without disabilities to live together in the community



- Individual Choice and Control
  - Ability to choose where/how someone wants to live
  - Ability to choose what services someone wants and how they will be provided
  - Control over housing setting through lease, ownership, etc.



#### Capital

- "Bricks & sticks"
- Acquiring/renovating/building a home

#### Operating

- Cost of sustaining the physical setting over the long term
- Rental payment, mortgage, home maintenance, utilities, etc.

#### Supports

Supports needed to help someone live successfully in his/her home



### Capital

- Public financing
  - Often tied to specific initiatives, eligibility requirements
  - NJ Housing & Mortgage
- Private financing
  - Bank mortgage
  - Need to be sure operating resources can support cost of mortgage over long term DHS/DDD 10



### Capital

#### Benefits

Ownership = longer-term control

#### Challenges

- Requires up-front investment
- Ongoing cost of operations/home ownership maintenance, etc.

# □ If rental, no need for capital investment



### Operating

- How will rent/mortgage be paid
  - Other costs of housing utilities, ongoing maintenance if property is owned



### Operating

- Housing subsidy
  - Tenant-based rental assistance
    - Housing Choice/Section 8 vouchers
    - Federal resource administered through local public housing authority (PHA)
    - Individual pays a percentage of income, voucher pays remainder of rent up to Fair Market Rent (FMR)



### Operating

- Rental in affordable housing development
  - Apartments with rents set to be affordable to people at lower income levels
  - Development with project-based rental assistance to make rent affordable
- Shared housing

Living with roommates to share costs of housing DHS/DDD



### **Supports**

- Natural supports family, neighbors, clergy, community
- Medicaid PCA program if documented need
- DDD Employment or Day Program
- DVRS, DDS, and other State agency supports



### **Considerations**

- Where do you want to live?
  - Urban, suburban, rural area
  - Apartment, house
  - Access to employment, community services, transportation

### What resources will you need vs. What resources do you have

- Capital
- Operating
- Supports



### **Considerations**

- Where are the gaps?
  - Identify additional resources
  - Revise plan
    - Changes don't have to be permanent



### **Considerations**

- Revisit Plan
  - Needs and desires change over time
  - Supportive housing means a change can happen in on area without changing all areas
