

Family education programs are held throughout the state and around the year, including:

- Pictures of Community Living Learning Events, which bring families together with representatives of

community provider agencies to talk about services and supports in the community.

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- Family visits to community living settings, which FEP arranges upon request.
- New Beginnings in Community Living
 Quarterly Newsletter, which is distributed to
 about 2400 family contacts of individuals living
 in the developmental centers.
- FEP website, www.umdnj.edu/linkweb, which provides access to all project publications and links to community information and resources related to Olmstead.
- New Beginnings Family Guide Services,
 which is a series of guides written for families
 of individuals living in the developmental centers that correspond to different phases of the
 transition process.

 comes together to brainstorm and share
 ideas with the FEP on issues of concern to
 families and ways to increase informed decision making.
