The Brain Injury Association of New Jersey is offering training and testing to become a Certified Brain Injury Specialist (CBIS). The CBIS training and examination is part of the Academy of Certified Brain Injury Specialists (ACBIS) which offers a voluntary national certification program for both entry-level staff and experienced professionals working in brain injury services.

## **REQUIREMENTS**:

Applicants must have worked or have had direct contact with one or more individuals with a brain injury, 10 hours per week (25% of a 40 hour work week) for a minimum of 12 months. Part-time employment must accomplish the same amount of required contact time within a 2 year period.

## **Required Paperwork:**

The registration fee is \$375, which includes The Essential Brain Injury Guide, materials, instructor time, lunch, and the ACBIS certification fee.
