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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JULY 2012

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of July, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,692 cases, from 40,986 in July 2011 to 39,294 in July 2012.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since July 2011 include Warren (9.5%), Passaic (7.8%), and Sussex (0.5%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since July 2011 were Monmouth (-15.8%), Morris (-18.2%), and Hunterdon (-19.7%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,512 or 21.7% were child-only in July 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,384), Camden (1,136), and Hudson (1,091).
- Essex (20,846), Passaic (12,339), and Camden (11,679) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in July 2012.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In July 2012, there were 406,698 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 25,060, or 6.6%, since July 2011.
- There were 816,581 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of July 2012, an increase of 44,857 or 5.8% since July 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since July 2011 are Monmouth (12.7%), Middlesex (11.9%), and Camden (9.8%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,373 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2012, a decrease of 733 or 10.3% since July 2011.
- In July 2012, EA payments were made for 1,558 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 6,645 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in July 2012, a decrease of 1,164 or 14.9% since July 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Middlesex (22.4%), Union (2.2), and Ocean (1.6%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 52,955 to 43,250 since July 2011, a decrease of 18.3%.
- There were 29,830 Employable GA and 13,420 Unemployable GA cases in July 2012.
- In July 2012, GA cases showed a 2.0 percent decrease since June 2012.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$325 million from April 2012 to June 2012, an increase of 1 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 0.8% from June 2011.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of July 2012, there were 4,225 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 593 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (948), Camden (513), and Hudson (488).





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With JULY 2012










ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
