# CURRENT PROGRAM Statistics

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had decreased by 5,868 cases, from 34,078 in June 2014 to 28,210 in June 2015, a decrease of 17.2%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since June 2014 were Warren (-41.2%), Salem (-34.0%), and Hunterdon (-32.9%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,999 or 24.8% were child-only in June 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,044), Camden (982), and Hudson (746).
- Essex (14,650), Passaic (8,462), Hudson (7,790), Camden (7,477), and Atlantic (5,149) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2015.

#### NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In June 2015, there were 444,706 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 1,568, or 0.4%, since June 2014.
- There were 883,659 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2015, an increase of 1,249 or 0.1% since June 2014.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since June 2014 are Morris (9.0%), Cape May (8.2%), and Bergen (7.3%).

#### EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 5,295 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2015, a decrease of 1,245 or 19.0% since June 2014.
- In June 2015, EA payments were made for 1,619 SSI recipients.

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 4,738 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in June 2015, a decrease of 874 or 15.6% since June 2014.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Salem (22.6%), Burlington (19.4%), and Somerset (17.2%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 32,231 to 25,603 since June 2014, a decrease of 20.6%.
- There were 14,664 Employable GA and 10,939 Unemployable GA cases in June 2015.
- Bergen (11.4%), Burlington (9.1%) and Atlantic (8.7%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since June 2014.
- In June 2015, GA cases showed a 2.0 percent decrease since May 2015.

#### CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$337 million from April 2015 to June 2015, an increase of 1.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2014.
- Total distributions increased 1.8% from June 2014.

#### WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)


- During the report month of June 2015, there were 3,515 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 534 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (932), Camden (371), and Hudson (365).
- There were 3,168 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





## ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
