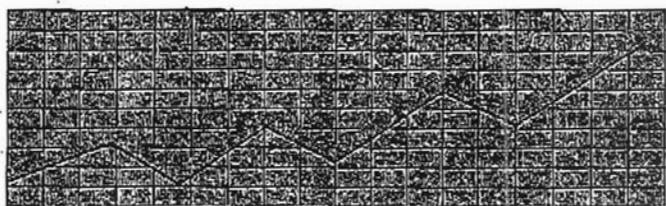

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS NOVEMBER 2009

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of November, the TANF caseload increased by 1,507 cases, from 37,287 in November 2008 to 38,794 in November 2009, a 4.0% increase.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since November 2008 include Ocean (32.2%), Warren (21.3%), and Gloucester (18.9%).
- The counties that decreased the most since November 2008 were Essex (-1.5%) and Union (-6.7 %)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,882 or 25.5% were child-only cases in November 2009
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,701), Hudson (1,370), and Camden (1,141).
- Essex (21,661), Hudson (12,530), and Camden (10,094) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in November 2009.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

- November 2009 there are 279,309 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 54,469, or 24.2%, since November 2008.
- There were 569,441 persons receiving food stamps as of November 2009, an increase of 106,446 or 23.0 % since November 2008.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since November 2008 are Hunterdon (45.3%), Cape May (36.9%), and Ocean (35.2%)

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 5,528 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in November 2009, an increase of 704 or 14.6% since November 2008.
- In November 2009, EA payments were made for 1,422 SSI recipients

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 7,671 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in November 2009, an increase of 678 or 9.7% since November 2008.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Burlington (108.0%), Hunterdon (105.7%), and Cape May (50.2%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 43,466 to 50,693 since November 2008, an increase of 16.6%.
- There were 33,154 Employable GA and 17,539 Unemployable GA recipients in November 2009.
- Hunterdon (51.2%), Ocean (44.2%), and Gloucester (34.3%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since November 2008.

CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 290 million dollars from October 2007 to September 2008, an increase of 7.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 13 percent from September 2007.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

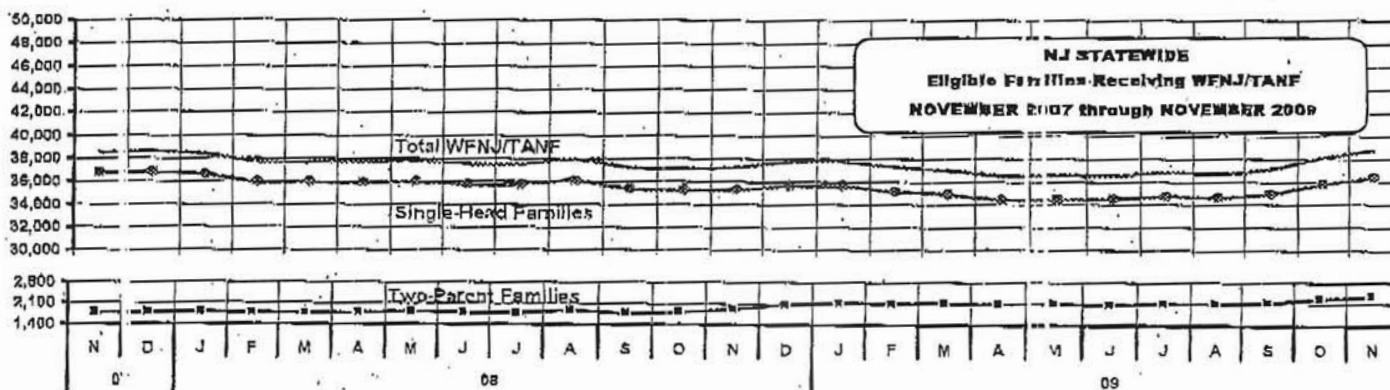
- During the report month of November 2009, there were 4,092 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 538 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment – related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (913), Hudson (517), and Camden (364).
- There were 3,627 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

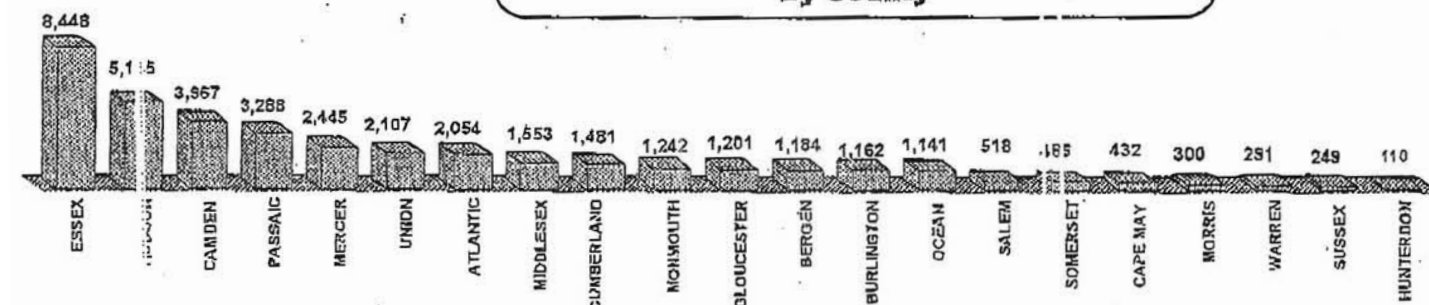

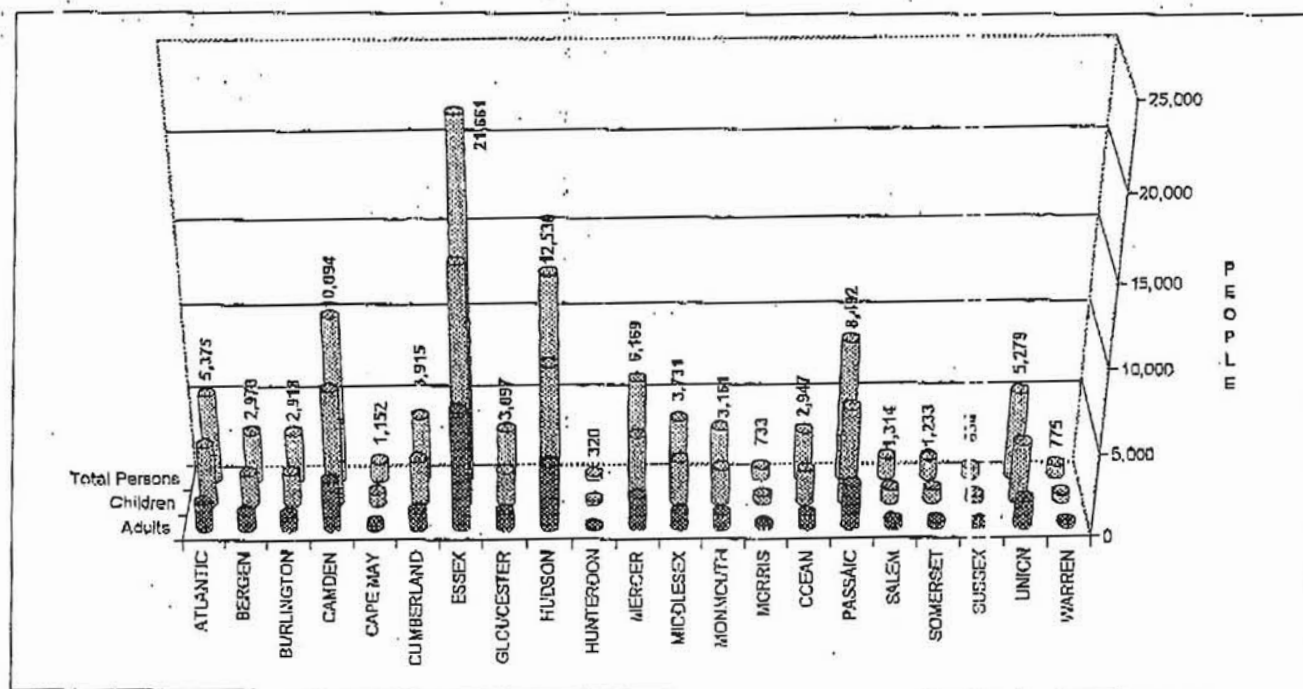

Ending With NOVEMBER 2009**

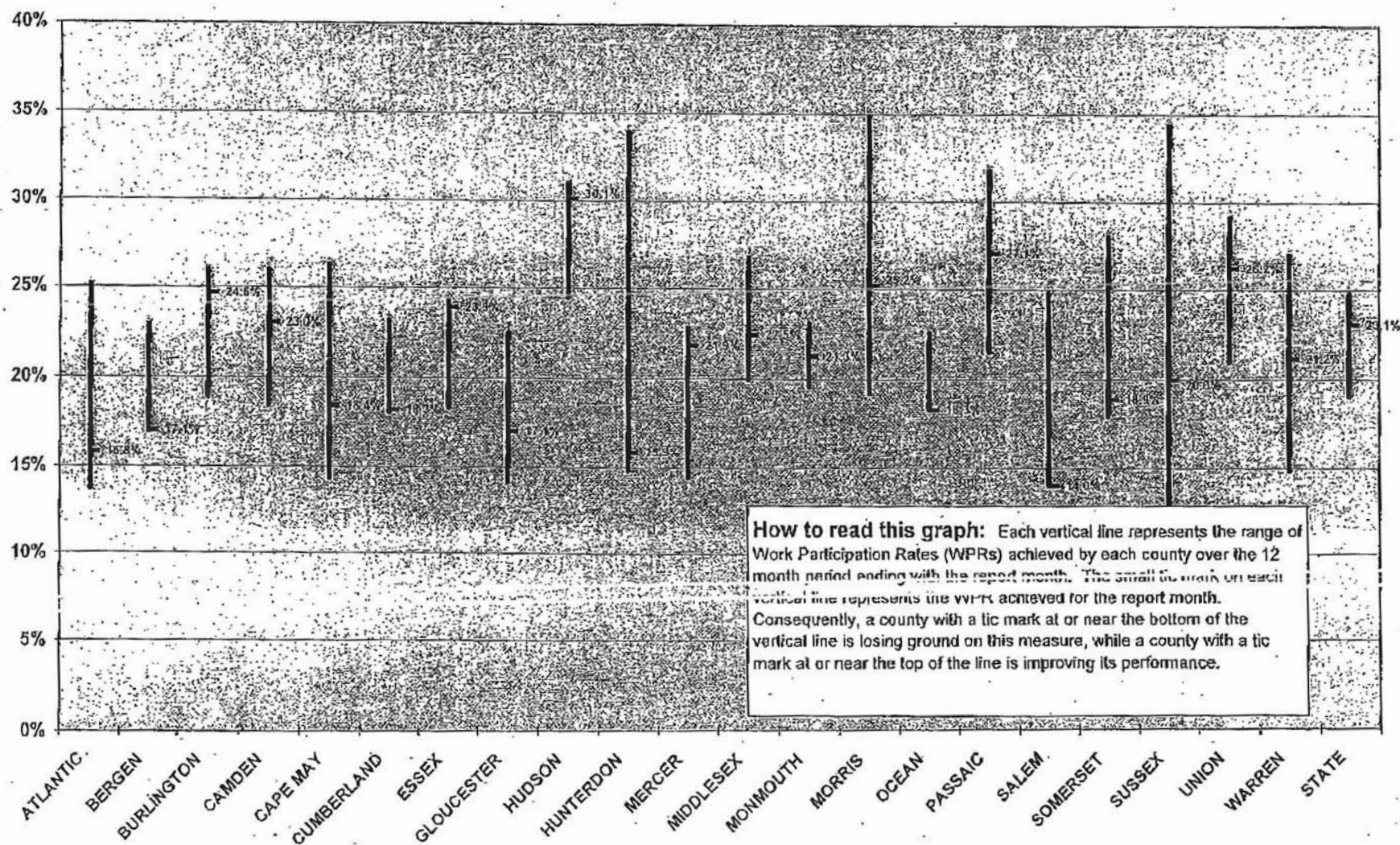

Statewide**

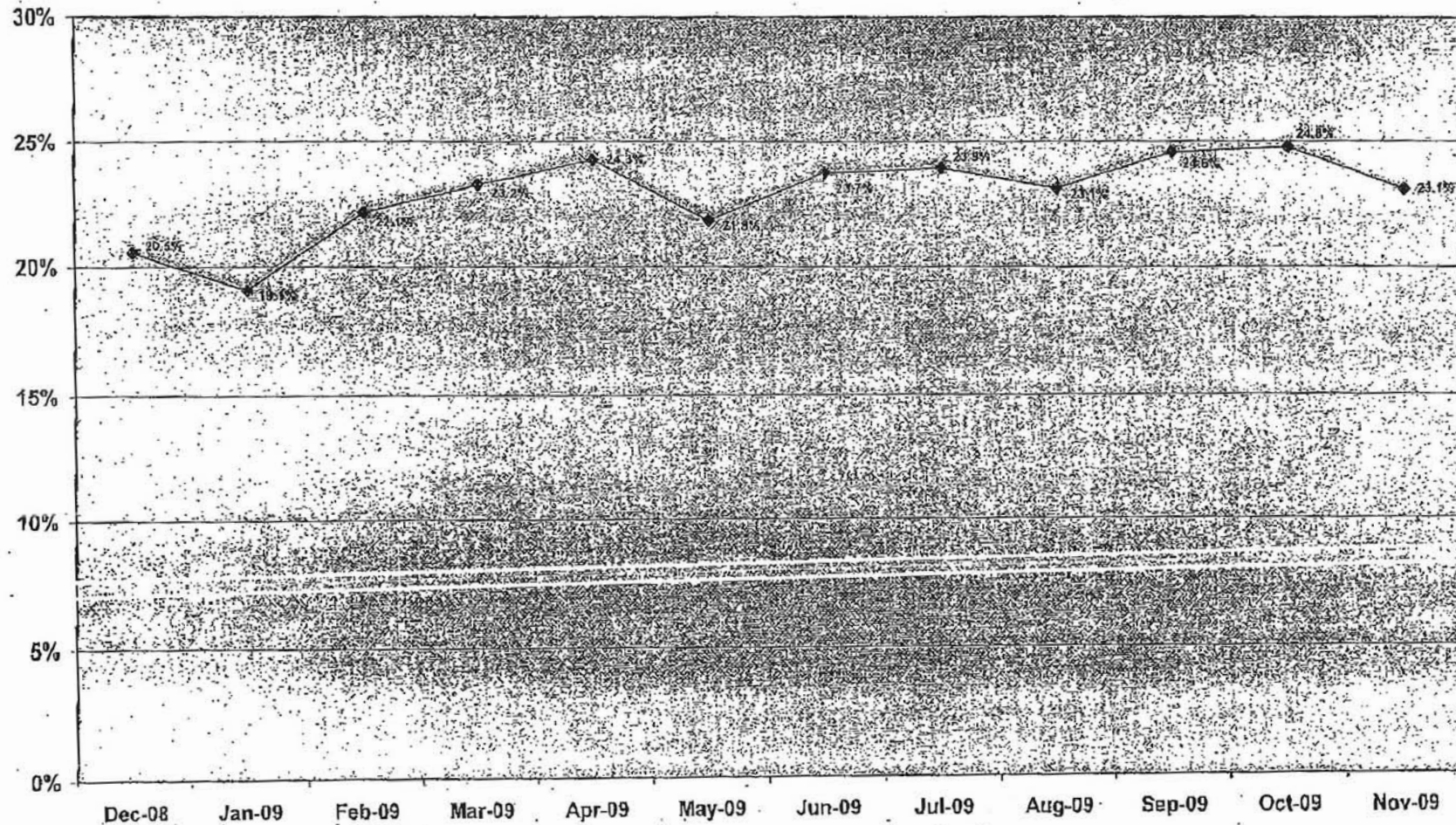

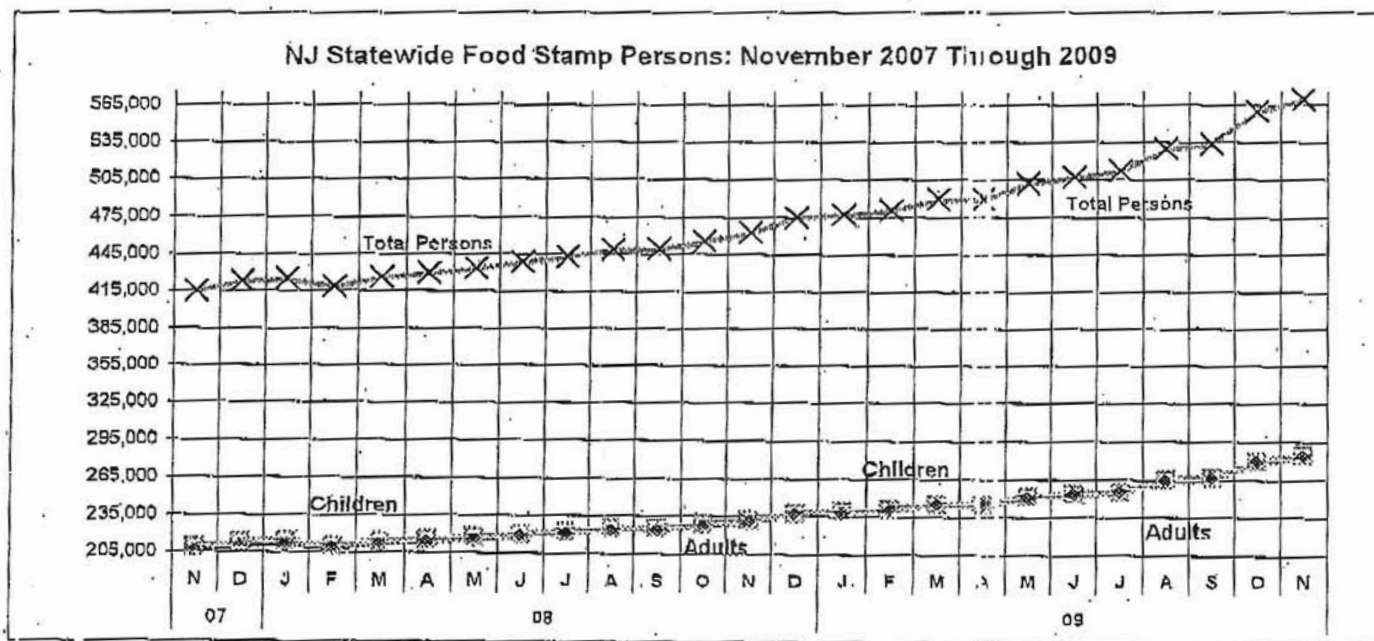
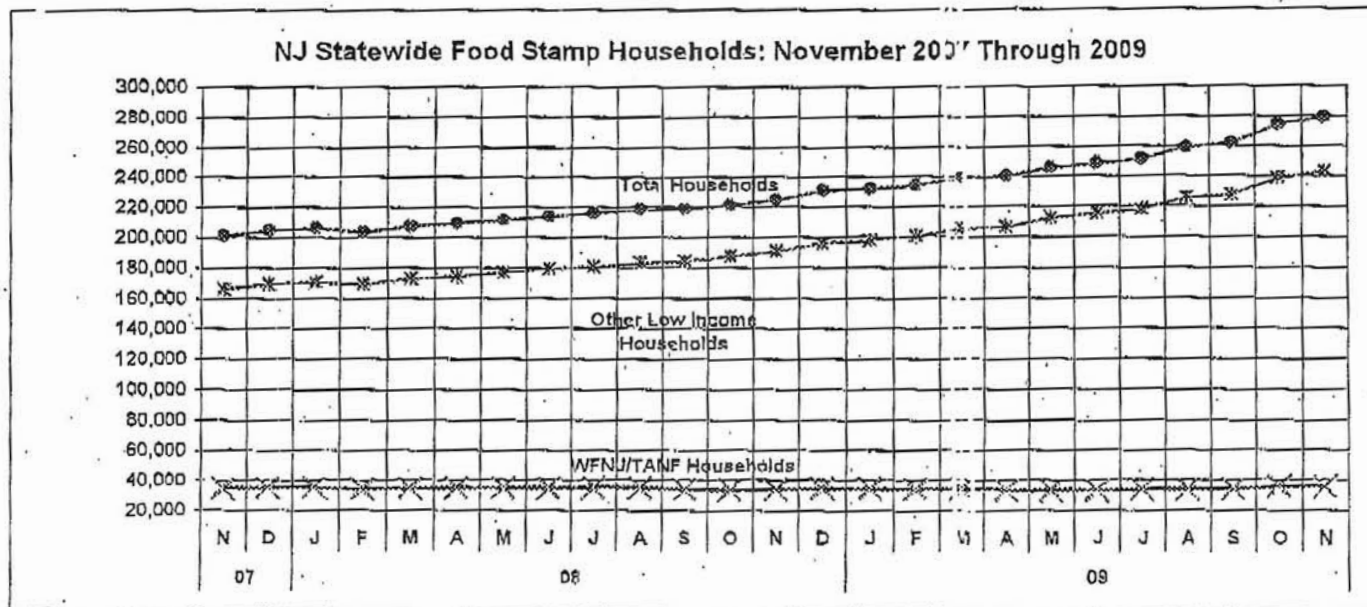

Total Food Stamp Recipients NOVEMBER 2009 By County

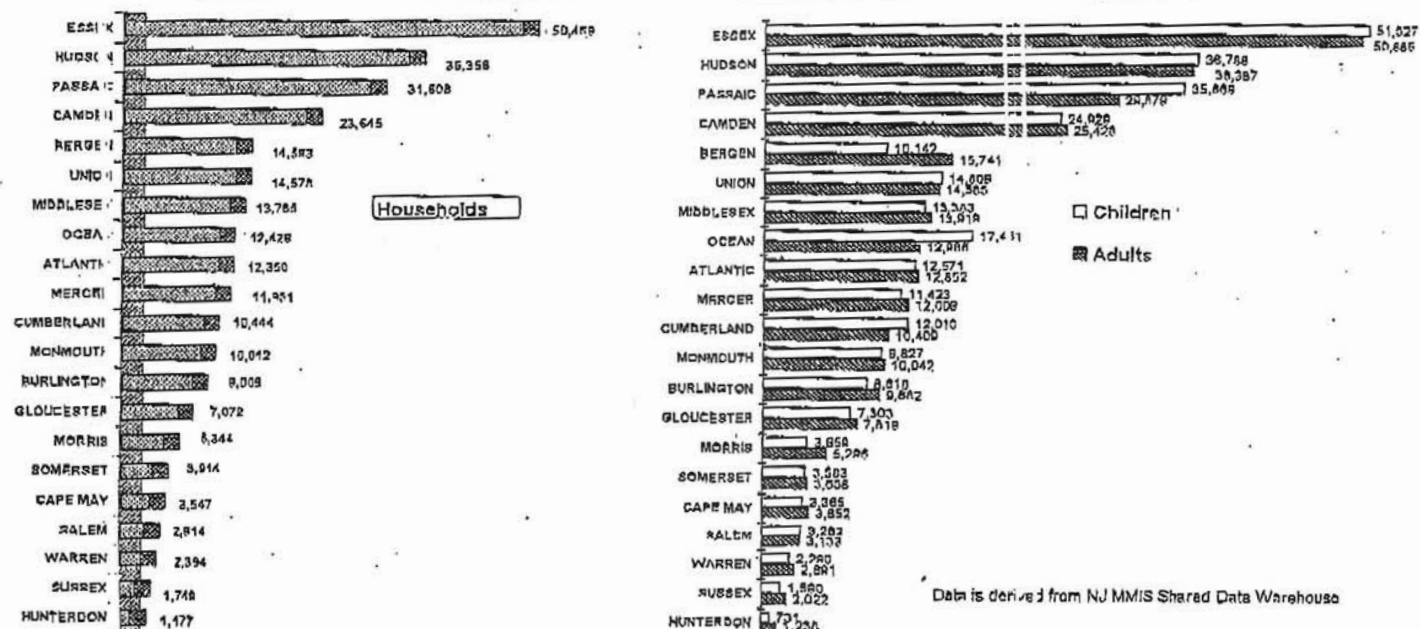


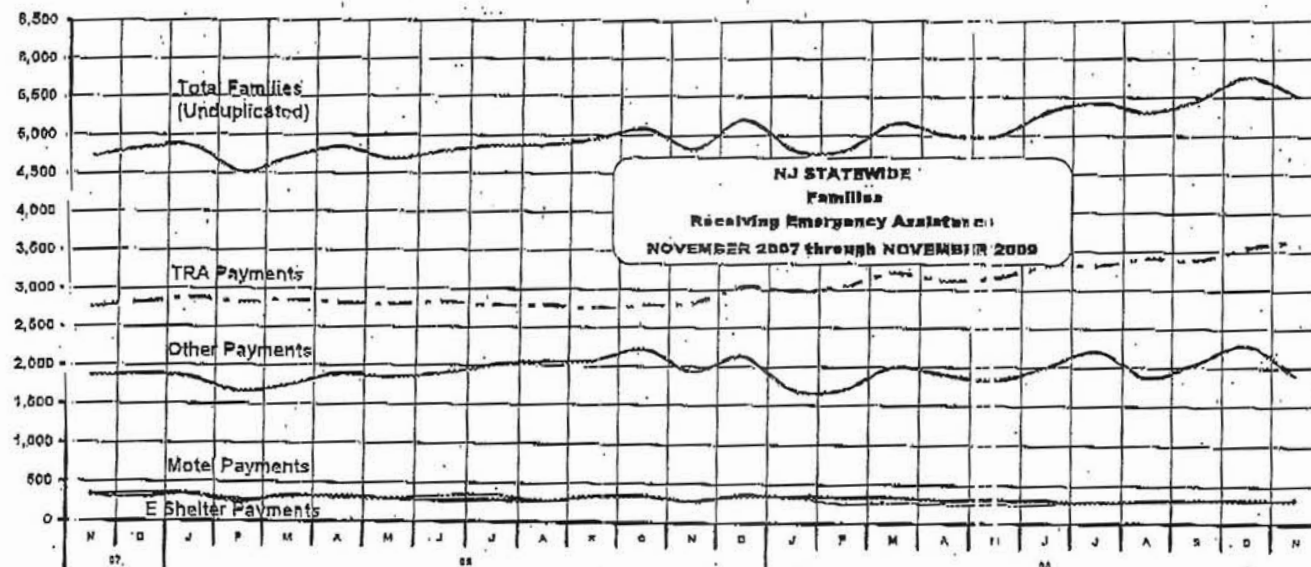
