**Name of Program:** Building Capacity for Medication Assisted Treatment in Ambulatory Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs

**Purpose:**

This Request for Proposal (RFP) sought to assist licensed ambulatory substance use disorder (SUD) programs in developing the capacity to offer medication assisted treatment (MAT) to people managing an opioid use disorder (OUD). This RFP is funded through the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration’s (SAMHSA) State Opioid Response grant (SOR). The SOR grant period is September 30, 2018 to September 29, 2020. Total funding is \$750,000 subject to federal appropriations. DMHAS awarded 10 awards of \$75,000 each for a maximum of one year to each selected provider.
