#### **Medicaid Comprehensive Waiver**

#### General Assistance (GA) Waiver approved

The Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) granted DMAHS a General Assistance (GA) Waiver enabling the Division to receive a federal match for health services for the GA population. Previously, the health care benefits were provided with state-only funds. The Department's press release is online.

#### Managed Care - Mandatory Enrollment

Effective July 1, 2011, upon adoption of the SFY 2012 budget, clients who were previously exempt from managed care enrollment, including the Aged, Blind and Disabled population, must be enrolled in one of four Medicaid health maintenance organizations (HMOs). #### Family Learning Conference a success

The fourth biennial Family Learning Conference for families with children who are Deaf and hard of hearing was held in April. More than 175 people attended the event, which empowers parents with resources to assist them address the impact of hearing loss on family life. The conference was sponsored by the NJ Department of Human Services' Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, the NJ Department of Health and Senior Services' Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Program, and the Statewide Parent Advocacy Network NJ Statewide Parent to Parent. Funding for the conference included a federal grant from the Center for Disease Control.
