3. The following is the basis for the claim made herein that the statute, rule, or regulation identified in paragraph II (1) is an unfunded mandate:

NJS1368 imposes an undue burden on the municipality by requiring the borough to create and maintain an unfunded business registry.

The state did not make any preparation for the cost of municipalities to establish the business insurance registry and enforce the provisions of the statute.

The legislation initially provided that this business insurance registry would be maintained by the department of community affairs, but was amended to impose this burden on the municipality.

The state did not take into account the funds necessary to create and maintain a business insurance registry which cost will now be a burden on the municipality.
