# ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

## MANSLAUGHTER

### Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 32 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for manslaughter during this year, a decrease of 3 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-two percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, and 28 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 16 percent of the arrests and 84 percent were non-Hispanic.

## SIMPLE ASSAULT

### Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 26,861 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for simple assault during this year, a decrease of 2 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 88 percent and juveniles accounted for 12 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 73 percent and females 27 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 34 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

## ARSON

### Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling, house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc.

- There were 295 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for arson during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 46 percent and juveniles accounted for 54 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-two percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 26 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 14 percent of the arrests and 86 percent were non-Hispanic.

# FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

## Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 1,725 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for forgery and counterfeiting during this year, a decrease of 3 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 98 percent and juveniles accounted for 2 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-eight percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 38 percent were black, and 4 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were non-Hispanic.

# FRAUD

## Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 4,115 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for fraud during this year, a decrease of 19 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 98 percent and juveniles accounted for 2 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 67 percent and females 33 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 37 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 15 percent of the arrests and 85 percent were non-Hispanic.

# EMBEZZLEMENT

## Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 171 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for embezzlement during this year, an increase of 16 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 98 percent and juveniles accounted for 2 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 60 percent and females 40 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-five percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 32 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 14 percent of the arrests and 86 percent were non-Hispanic.

# STOLEN PROPERTY

(Buying Receiving, Possessing)

## Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- There were 3,234 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for stolen property; buying, receiving, possessing, etc. during this year, a decrease of 14 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 80 percent and juveniles accounted for 20 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-six percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 53 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were non-Hispanic.

# CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

## Definition

Criminal/Malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 5,682 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for criminal/malicious mischief during this year, a decrease of 13 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 67 percent and juveniles accounted for 33 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-one percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 28 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were non-Hispanic.

# WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

## Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statute controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 4,405 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for weapons; carrying, possessing, etc. during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 74 percent and juveniles accounted for 26 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 87 percent and females 13 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-eight percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 51 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 19 percent of the arrests and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

# PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

## Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc.

- There were 1,496 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for prostitution and commercialized vice during this year, an increase of 6 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent and juveniles accounted for 1 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 24 percent and females 76 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-five percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 40 percent were black, and 5 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 25 percent of the arrests and 75 percent were non-Hispanic.

# SEX OFFENSES

## Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 1,471 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for sex offenses (except forcible rape and prostitution) during this year, a decrease of 5 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 81 percent and juveniles accounted for 19 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 89 percent and females 11 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 26 percent were black, and 4 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 31 percent of the arrests and 69 percent were non-Hispanic.

# DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

## Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing/possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

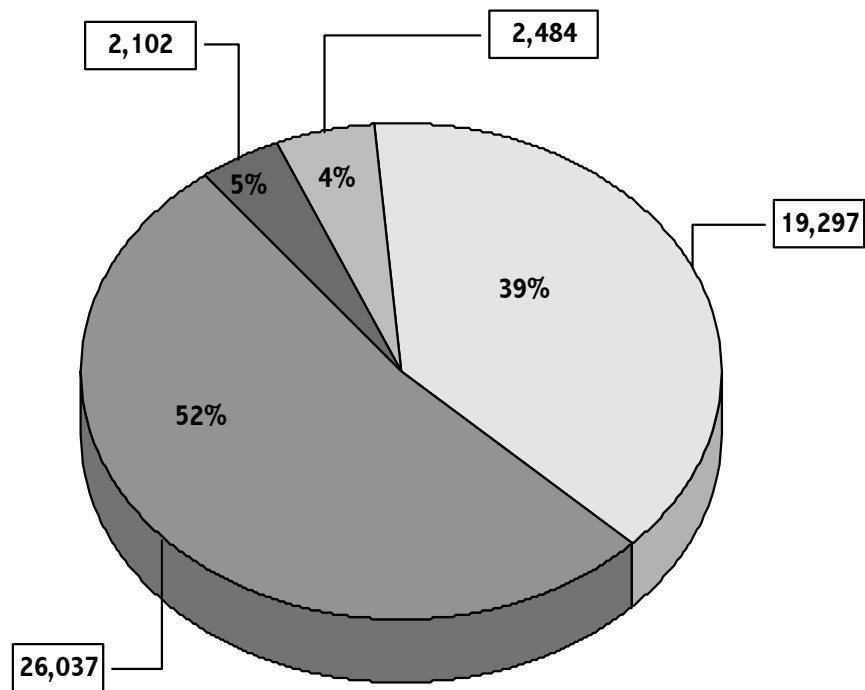
- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics: manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (Demerol, methadone).
- d. Other: dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).

- There were 49,920 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for drug abuse violations during this year, a decrease of 6 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent and juveniles accounted for 10 percent of the arrests.

- Forty-three percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-six percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 43 percent were black and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 14 percent of the arrests and 86 were non-Hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 75 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 25 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 32 percent of the possession/use category and 58 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 39 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

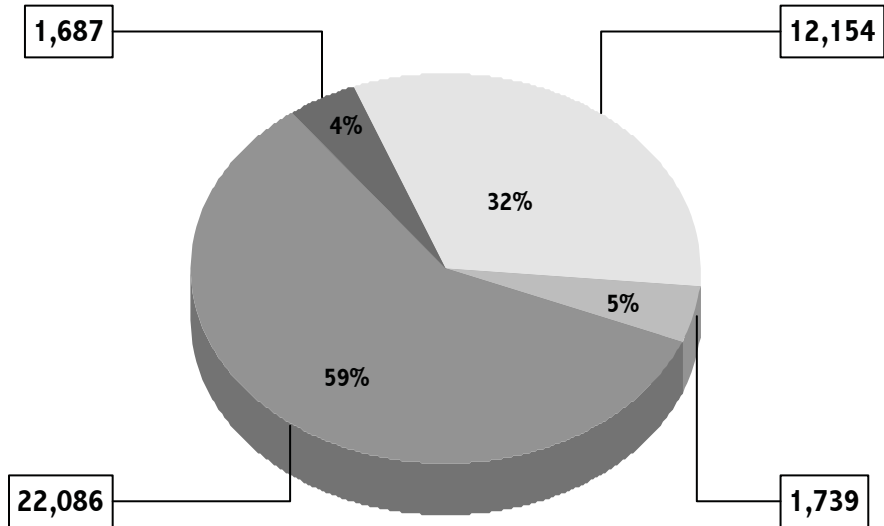

## POSSESSION/USE ARRESTS

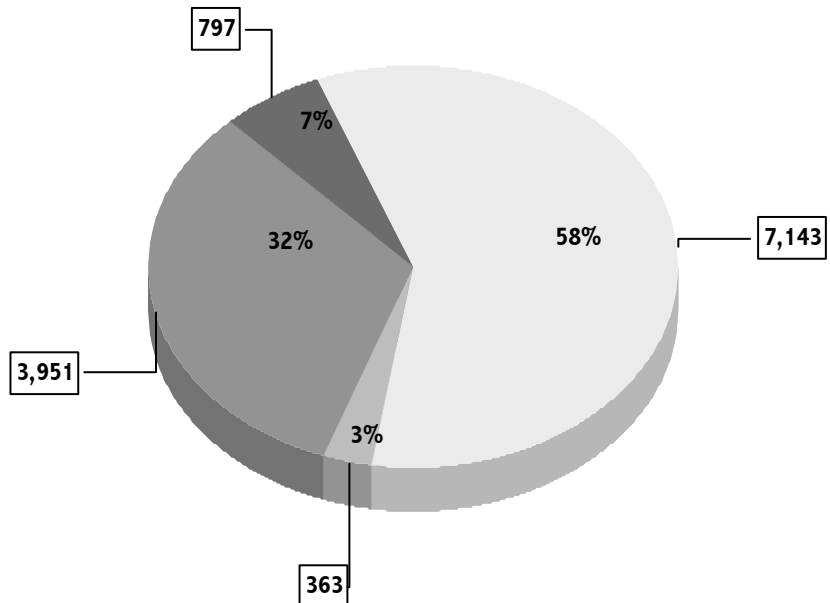

# GAMBLING

## Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 107 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for gambling during this year, a decrease of 60 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 83 percent and juveniles accounted for 17 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of the arrests.
- Eighty percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 18 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 42 percent of the arrests and 58 percent were non-Hispanic.

# OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

## Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 13,335 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for offenses against family and children during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent and juveniles accounted for 1 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 89 percent and females 11 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-seven percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 42 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 12 percent of the arrests and 88 percent were non-Hispanic.

# DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

## Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 26,639 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for driving under the influence during this year, a decrease of 4 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent and juveniles accounted for 1 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 67 percent and females 33 percent of the arrests.
- Eighty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 14 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were non-Hispanic.



# LIQUOR LAWS

## Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of 'driving under the influence'.

- There were 6,970 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for liquor laws during this year, a decrease of 5 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 70 percent and juveniles accounted for 30 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females 28 percent of the arrests.
- Eighty-nine percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 9 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 10 percent of the arrests and 90 percent were non-Hispanic.

# DISORDERLY CONDUCT

## Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 20,215 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for disorderly conduct during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 83 percent and juveniles accounted for 17 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 78 percent and females 22 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-two percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 37 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were non-Hispanic.

# VAGRANCY

## Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

- There were 850 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for vagrancy during this year, a decrease of 43 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 85 percent and females 15 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-two percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, and 47 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 9 percent of the arrests and 91 percent were non-Hispanic.

Percent distribution may not add to 100 due to rounding.

# ALL OTHER OFFENSES

## Definition

Included in this category are all violation of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 143,082 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for all other offenses (except traffic) during this year, a decrease of 9 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adults accounted for 96 percent and juveniles accounted for 4 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 76 percent and females 24 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-two percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 47 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 15 percent of the arrests and 85 percent were non-Hispanic.

# CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

## Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 3,428 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for curfew and loitering law violations during this year, a decrease of 39 percent when compared to 2009.
- Males accounted for 70 percent and females 30 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, and 56 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

# RUNAWAYS

## Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 3,500 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for runaways during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2009.
- Males accounted for 43 percent and females 57 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-one percent of total persons arrested in 2010 were white, 58 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 27 percent of the arrests and 73 percent were non-Hispanic.
