Atlantic County

VOLUME/RATE

- A total of 10,801 Crime Index Offenses were reported to the police of Atlantic County during 2011, a 7 percent decrease when compared to 2010.
- Violent crimes decreased 11 percent while the nonviolent crime category decreased 7 percent.
- The crime rate for Atlantic County was recorded at 39.3 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, a decrease of 7 percent compared to the previous year.
- Murder remained the same in 2011. Rape increased from 54 in 2010 to 57 in 2011.
- Robbery decreased from 716 in 2010 to 603 in 2011. Burglary increased from 2,099 in 2010 to 2,144 in 2011.
- Aggravated assault decreased from 767 in 2010 to 712 in 2011.
- The total value of property stolen in Atlantic County amounted to \$12.6 million, of which 18 percent was recovered.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 15,022 persons arrested during 2011, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent when compared to 2010.
- Adult arrests increased 1 percent to 13,453 and juvenile arrests decreased 10 percent to 1,569 in 2011.
- The total clearance rate for Index offenses was 23 percent; juveniles were responsible for 11 percent of those cases.

Bergen County

VOLUME/RATE

- A total of 12,324 Crime Index Offenses were reported to the police of Bergen County during 2011, a 1 percent decrease when compared to 2010.
- Violent crimes decreased 6 percent while the nonviolent crime category decreased 1 percent.
- The crime rate for Bergen County was recorded at 13.6 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, a decrease of 1 percent compared to the previous year.
- Murder decreased from 11 in 2010 to 7 in 2011. Rape decreased from 27 in 2010 to 24 in 2011.
- Robbery increased from 288 in 2010 to 306 in 2011. Burglary increased from 1,963 in 2010 to 2,148 in 2011.
- Aggravated assault decreased from 598 in 2010 to 530 in 2011.
- The total value of property stolen in Bergen County amounted to \$40.4 million, of which 18 percent was recovered.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 21,954 persons arrested during 2011, an increase of 2 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adult arrests increased 3 percent to 19,089 and juvenile arrests decreased 9 percent to 2,865 in 2011.
