New Jersey American Legion Economics and Employment Chairman, Robert Looby, has answered the call of duty.

The Department of Defense operational organization Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve recognized Looby with the prestigious Seven Seals Award for his tireless dedication to veteran issues and his meritorious service to members of the National Guard and Reserve.

The award, depicting the heraldry seals of the seven military services, is given at the discretion of the New Jersey ESGR Chairman to recognize the efforts by a citizen, business or organization, whose supportive actions have benefited all of the Guard/Reserve components in a significant manner.

Looby understands that finding veter-

ans, military spouses and citizen Guard-members meaningful employment is mission critical in our Post-911 society. This passionate volunteer has whole-heartedly embraced the challenge and works diligently with his Hiring Our Heroes partners, including the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation, to realize their objectives.

The task is enormous but Looby appears dauntless. With the broad responsibility for veterans' employment, his days are consumed with coordinating veteran job fairs, working with homeless and student veterans to prepare them for the civilian job market and organizing New Jersey Attorney General Veterans Civil rights seminars.

Looby initiated the nation's first veterans-only job fair. He began with a partnership with NBC Network and continued with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Looby's model for veteran job-fairs is used by Legion Posts and organizations throughout the nation.

As an Army Veteran himself, the American Legion leader understands that veterans bring a unique skillset to the civilian workforce.

As there is no rest for the weary, Looby is sure to carry his weight behind the multi-year veterans hiring initiative with the lofty goal of helping 500,000 veterans and military spouses get employment by the end of 2014.

ESGR is a mostly volunteer, Department of Defense agency which seeks to create a culture where American employers value and support the military service of their Guard and Reserve employees. They recognize outstanding support, increase awareness of the law, and resolve conflicts through mediation.

Military parenting website assists communication

Service members who deploy or are otherwise separated from their families due to mission needs now have an online resource allowing them to hone their parenting skills as they reconnect with their children.

Pam Murphy, the Defense Department's lead psychologist for the website, said the launch of http://www.militaryparenting.org offers unprecedented, comprehensive and free computer-based training from a service member's perspective on parenting and building strong relationships with their children.

A clinical psychologist with more than 20 years of experience in community and private practice, Murphy said the Integrated Mental Health Strategy Program is a collaborative initiative between the Veterans Affairs Department and DOD.

"We initially did an environmental scan of everything within the DOD as well as commercially available, and one of the areas that seemed to be at a deficit was a comprehensive parenting program that looks at the basics," Murphy said.

She noted that while a plethora of parenting information exists online, it was difficult to identify a free, private "military-centric" program.

"This is one of the first of its kind," Murphy said. The interactive site, she explained, develops and reinforces parenting skills to help families reconnect through in-depth technology solutions that appeal to younger parents.

"Many of the parents in the service member population are generally younger," she said. "Prominent age groups of their children are typically 5 or below."

Murphy added that the site goes beyond the job and hits home in terms of affecting family relationships, building resilience and helping service members to be happy with their lives within the military.

She also noted that service members' personalized accounts interwoven into the site make the situations and solutions relatable.

"We included videos of real service personnel... to talk about their real-life experiences with parenting, reintegrating and making those everyday decisions," Murphy said.

The website consolidates and simplifies information that was previously accessible across multiple resources, said Air Force Senior Airman Matthew Siegele, a protocol specialist, and his wife, Air Force Staff Sgt. Sabrina Siegele, noncommissioned officer in charge of knowledge operations, both of whom work at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Wash.

"We've been through so many parenting classes, counseling and therapy, and a lot of the resources and advice is mirrored on this site," Sabrina said. "This website is excellent - it's a one-stop




shop instead of jumping around to multiple appointments."

During family separations, Murphy said, applications such as Skype and Facetime can help in keeping families connected, but the military parenting website provides ideas for technology-based activities that can help in reuniting parents and children after a deployment. "A lot of times, kids don't know what to talk about with their parents when they are on the phone or on the computer with them," she said.

Murphy said the website can help military parents to reconnect with their children.

"Parents can benefit from this site, and I believe they want their kids to grow up to be happy, healthy, fully functioning adults," she said. "Here, they'll find strategies and ideas to [get] even better in terms of helping kids to grow, mature and blossom."

Recording our veterans history for future generations

On Sept. 17, Haven Hospice volunteers got together to interview a few veterans at the New Jersey Veterans Memorial Home at Menlo Park, as part of the Veteran Oral History Project.

The mission of the Veterans Oral History Project is to interview and record veteran's experiences which are then submitted to the Library of Congress and stored for future generations to hear from veterans, in their own words, the realities of war.

With the assistance of Haven Hospice volunteer, Marie Keane, Vietnam veteran and Purple Heart recipient, Joseph Belardo, interviewed and recorded World War II veteran, Eugene Cook's account of his time in Pearl Harbor following the attack, and Lorraine Hochheim's experience as a member of the Women's Army Corps during World War II.

As Cook and Hochheim recounted their experience, volunteers from Haven Hospice, Patricia Casterline, Deborah Chalfin and Maureen David, were greatly moved by the stories.

Haven Hospice is a national partner of the We Honor Veterans Program, a pioneering campaign developed by the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization in collaboration with the Department of Veterans Affairs. As a We Honor Veterans Partner, Haven Hospice will implement ongoing veteran-centered education for their staff and volunteers to help improve the care they provide to the veterans they proudly serve.

The Veterans Memorial Home at Menlo Park hopes to record the experience of many more of their veterans for posterity.

WHO: 1 USA Officer, 1 ARNG Officer, 1 ARNG NCO, and 25 ALB Psychologist; sponsored by EUCOM, Embassy, ODC & SPP WHAT: Traveling Contact Team conducting a Chaplaincy Development event with the Albanian Armed Forces (AAF) Psychologist staff and local religious leaders. NJNG representatives from the 42nd RSG and the EUCOM Deputy Command Chaplain traveled to Albania in order to conduct this event and plan for future events.

WHEN: 22-28 September 2013

WHERE: Tirana, Albania.

WHY: The purpose of this event was twofold; (1) Chaplaincy Development: basic assessment of the current state of the AAF chaplain corps, and also providing initial outreach to civilian religious community leaders. (2) Soldier Welfare Program: assess the current status of AAF efforts to support its personnel and their families and provide advisement based on NJNG lessons learned.

RESULTS: The local civilian faith groups that the TCT met with are eager to provide chaplains to the AAF. They are also ready to train, equip, and endorse qualified candidates for the chaplaincy. The TCT identified many of the unit-level Command Psychologists require basic skills that could be provided through the NJNG R3SP (Resiliency Risk-Reduction & Suicide Prevention) Program's curriculum of instruction. Getting personnel certified on ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training) and Resilience would be a good start in equipping the AAF PHP to care for its Soldiers and Families


