SUBJECT: **Administrative Order 2022-03 (HAZMAT Extension)**

Today I have signed Administrative Order 2022-03, ordering that:

- Any valid Hazardous Materials (“HAZMAT”) endorsement due for renewal that expired or would otherwise expire between July 1, 2022, and December 27, 2022, shall be extended for a period of 180 days.
- All commercial drivers eligible for this extension must hold a valid CDL and initiate the process to renew their security threat assessment no later than 60 days before the extended HAZMAT endorsement expiration date.
- This exemption does not apply to any new applications for HAZMAT endorsement or any other commercial vehicle licensing requirements under 49 CFR Parts 383 and 384.

Please note that nothing in this Order shall be construed as restoring the commercial driving privileges of any individual subject to an order of suspension, or a suspension order imposed after the date of this Order.

Commercial drivers must continue to comply with all safety requirements governing the operation of commercial motor vehicles, including the maintenance of insurance.
