FAQ - INSULIN DEPENDENT DIABETIC DESIGNATION

- Why might I want my insulin-dependent diabetes to be designated on my driver's license or non-driver identification card?
 - The information will be used by law enforcement officials or emergency medical professionals to identify a person as an insulin-dependent diabetic and provide the person with necessary medical attention should that individual be unable to communicate due to a diabetic seizure.
- How will my insulin-dependent diabetes be designated on my driver's license or non-driver ID?
 - There will be a "5" indicated under the word "restrictions."
- How will law enforcement or emergency medical professionals know what the "5" restriction means?
 - You will be issued a pink "designation/restriction" card to be kept with your driver's license or non-driver ID. It will say that you have insulin-dependent diabetes.
- What kind of documentation will I need to provide in order to have the designation added to my <u>driver's license or non-driver ID</u>?
 - You will need all of the following documentation:
 - A statement on your doctor's prescription pad indicating that you have insulin dependent diabetes.
 - The completed "Request for Insulin Dependent Designation" (Form MR-20; you will get this when you visit a motor vehicle agency to complete the process).
 - 6 Points of ID
- Where do I apply if I have a <u>driver's license or non-driver ID</u>?
 - This can only be done in person by you. Visit a motor vehicle agency; bring all of your necessary documentation and the fee.
- Is there a fee?
 - Yes, you must pay the \$11.00 fee for a duplicate license or non-driver ID. If it is time to renew your license or ID you will just pay the renewal fee which is \$24.00.
- Will I have to provide updated information at renewal time?
 - No, once the designation has been indicated, it will carry over when you

renew your driver's license or non-driver ID.

- If I am insulin dependent, must I have this designation on my driver's license or non-driver ID?
 - No, it is voluntary. You can choose if you want it on your driver's license or nondriver ID.
- Can I remove the designation after it is put on my driver's license or non-driver ID?
 - Yes, it is voluntary to have the designation.
- How do I remove the designation?
 - You would need to do all the following:
 - Visit any motor vehicle agency.
 - Complete a "Request for Insulin Dependent Designation" (Form MR-20 found only at agencies) and indicate that you want to remove the designation.
 - Present 6 Points of ID.
 - Pay the \$11.00 fee for a duplicate license or non-driver ID
- Can I add it back if I want to?
 - Yes. You would need all of the following:
 - A statement on your doctor's prescription pad indicating that you have insulin dependent diabetes.
 - The completed "Request for Insulin Dependent Designation" (Form MR-20 found only at agencies).
 - 6 Points of ID.
 - \$11.00 fee for a duplicate license.
