Since 1981, the NJ Building Authority has been dedicated to serving the needs of the public by providing and delivering exceptional facilities throughout New Jersey. Many of these construction projects directly and indirectly impact the welfare of our State and our residents.

Recent projects include the Regional Operations Intelligence Center in Ewing, designed to serve as a command center during homeland security threats and emergency response efforts; and the State Police Technology Complex in Hamilton Township, home to one of only four FBI Regional Computer Forensics Labs in the country. In addition, ground was recently broken for their newest project, the New Jersey Public Health, Environmental and Agricultural Laboratory. This facility is located at the State Police Headquarters in West Trenton, and will ensure that we are prepared for any event that may endanger the public's health, our environment, livestock and crops. The facility should be fully operational in 2010.

Furthermore, the New Jersey State Museum has reopened after undergoing a much needed renovation. These upgrades, the first significant changes since its opening in 1965, have transformed the Museum from an outdated repository to a stylish exhibition. In May 2008, the Super Science Weekend kicked off the first phase of the Museum's reopening. Visitors participated in educational, hands-on activities exploring all fields of science. "Cultures in Context, a Tapestry of Expression" was the featured exhibit and marked the beginning of many new and exciting programs scheduled this year.

These are just a few examples of the Building Authority's projects that are making a difference throughout the State. I congratulate the Authority on their achievements and look forward to working with them in the future.
