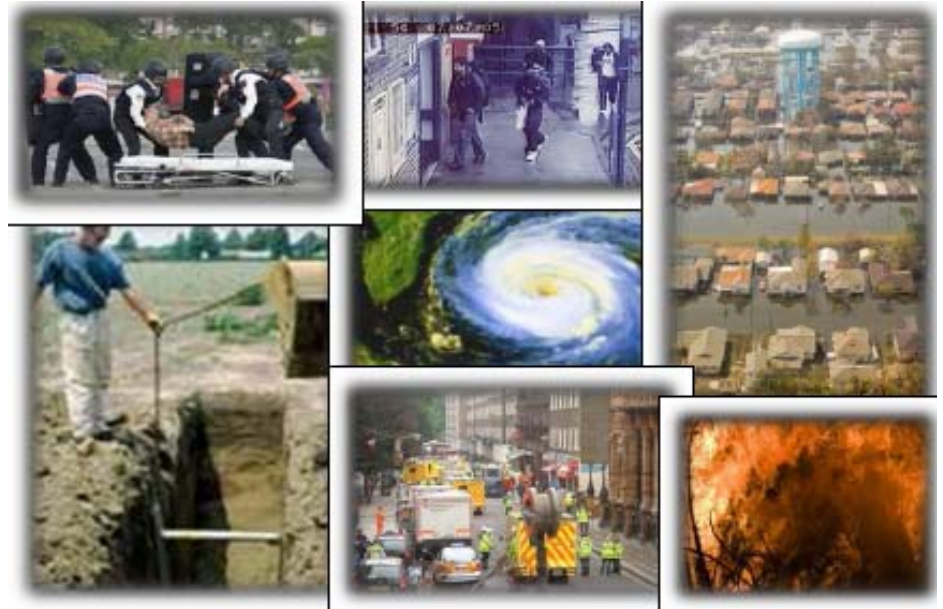

The National Planner's Course is an application based series of workshops designed to train the fundamentals of planning to selected Federal, State, local and tribal planners. Each workshop uses the Federal Plan Development Process and is linked by use of an unclassified scenario, an introductory vignette, a process presentation, and a practical exercise.

This 40 hour program of instruction is conducted over a five day period by certified instructors with practical planning experience and is supported through the DHS Office of Policy, Office of Strategy, Planning, Analysis and Risk (SPAR), the DHS Chief Learning Officer and the Planning Division of Federal Emergency Management Agency. This course is a key step in the series of planning skills development process.

Although not required, each participant is encouraged to complete the following on line courses:

- NS 100: *Introduction to Incident Command System, IS-100*
- NS 200: *Basic Incident Command System, IS-200*
- IS 700: *National Incident Management System (NIMS): An Introduction*
- IS 800.B: *National Response Framework (NRF): An Introduction*
