✓ VERIFY OS Version - This can be verified by right clicking on the my computer or computer icon located on your desktop. Select "properties" by left clicking on it and a pop window will display the operating system version as shown in below figure.

• DNS SERVER ENTRY

✓ Add an IP Address - 10.11.132.146 with the host name http://gsn-prod2.njsp.org:8011/njsp_ucr/ to the local DNS SERVER, and County DNS Server (if coming through COUNTY to connect to the above URL successfully).

INTERNET EXPLORER VERSION

✓ 8.0 (NJSP STANDARD) OR HIGHER is an acceptable browser against which the e-UCR application has been successfully tested. Mozilla Firefox, Google Chrome or any other browsers are not compatible with this application. e-UCR has been tested successfully on Internet Explorer version 8.0.

• SET-UP COMPATIBILITY VIEW

✓ If you have internet explorer version higher than 8.0 and are having difficulty submitting your UCR report than please request your it liaison to set up your e-UCR in the Compatibility View from the Tools menu.

VERIFYING AN INTERNET EXPLORER

✓ From the menu select Help, then About Internet Explorer. A window will pop-up displaying the Internet Explorer version as shown in the below figure.

This error message is received when you are attempting to view the Crime Trend Reports. This error message informs you that you do not have an ActiveX downloaded on your computer to view the Crime Trend Reports. Crime Trend Reports are developed using Crystal Reports.

ActiveX is an independent objects, modules or applets that can be accessed from any Windows application. ActiveX are small programs that run within Web browsers. ActiveX controls that work within Internet Explorer are usually associated with a certain file or media type. This way Internet Explorer knows which control to launch – PDF, Crystal Reports, Flash, Windows Media Player – for each type of file.

To view these reports one needs to download an ActiveX from the link within the eUCR Message Board.

✓ To download Active X – click on the "HERE" link and do not close or "x" out of the internet explorer until you see the below message displayed as

below. You may have to click on the link again to download the ActiveX object as it transmits from State Police in packets and it is safe.

YOU HAVE SUCCESSFULLY DOWNLOADED AN ACTIVEX CONTROL TO RUN CRYSTAL REPORTS. PLEASE CLOSE THE BROWSER AND CONTINUE WITH YOUR APPLICATION.

✓ After downloading it successfully you must close the browser and login again for the changes to be effective. Now you should be able to open and view the Crime Trend Reports. Ensure for IE version higher than 8.0, IE is set up in a Compatibility View, otherwise you will not be able to view the reports.

In addition, mandatory statewide carjacking data collection program. Accessibility to this program is provided through the New Jersey Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NJLETS) File 19 and 20. The database for this program is located at the State Police Division Headquarters, Identification and Information Technology Section, Uniform Crime Reporting Unit, West Trenton, New Jersey. This carjacking data collection program identifies geographic problem areas; profiles of carjacking locations; descriptions of vehicles being carjacked; age, sex, and race of victims and offenders; types of weapons used; additional crimes committed; and estimates regarding the value of vehicles stolen. The Attorney General has mandated, through Executive Directive 1993-1 that every law enforcement agency notify the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit of all reported carjacking incidents, whether actual or attempted. Notification must be done through NJLETS, as soon as possible, not to exceed more than twenty-four hours from the time the incident is reported.
