Atlantic County

VOLUME/RATE

- A total of 11,629 Crime Index Offenses were reported to the police of Atlantic County during 2010, an 8 percent increase when compared to 2009.
- Violent crimes increased 6 percent while the nonviolent crime category increased 8 percent.
- The crime rate for Atlantic County was recorded at 42.4 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, an increase of 6 percent compared to the previous year.
- Murder decreased from 24 in 2009 to 22 in 2010. Rape decreased from 60 in 2009 to 54 in 2010.
- Robbery increased from 625 in 2009 to 716 in 2010. Burglary increased from 1,777 in 2009 to 2,099 in 2010.
- Aggravated assault increased from 757 in 2009 to 767 in 2010.
- The total value of property stolen in Atlantic County amounted to \$14.5 million, of which 16 percent was recovered.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 15,074 persons arrested during 2010, a decrease of 15 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adult arrests decreased 14 percent to 13,325 and juvenile arrests decreased 19 percent to 1,749 in 2010.
- The total clearance rate for Index offenses was 23 percent; juveniles were responsible for 14 percent of those cases.

Bergen County

VOLUME/RATE

- A total of 12,492 Crime Index Offenses were reported to the police of Bergen County during 2010, a 2 percent decrease when compared to 2009.
- Violent crimes decreased 3 percent while the nonviolent crime category decreased 2 percent.
- The crime rate for Bergen County was recorded at 13.8 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, a decrease of 3 percent compared to the previous year.
- Murder increased from 4 in 2009 to 11 in 2010. Rape remained the same in 2010.
- Robbery decreased from 311 in 2009 to 288 in 2010. Burglary increased from 1,943 in 2009 to 1,963 in 2010.
- Aggravated assault decreased from 615 in 2009 to 598 in 2010.
- The total value of property stolen in Bergen County amounted to \$37.8 million, of which 21 percent was recovered.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 21,605 persons arrested during 2010, an increase of 1 percent when compared to 2009.
- Adult arrests increased 3 percent to 18,466 and juvenile arrests decreased 12 percent to 3,139 in 2010.
