Dear Governor and Members of the Legislature:

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:17B-5.5, I am submitting the forty-fifth annual report of crime in New Jersey. The annual report is based on crime statistics submitted to the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System by every New Jersey law enforcement agency for the year 2011.

Effective law enforcement requires accurate crime statistics in order to identify the extent, type, and location of criminal activity. Criminal Justice administrators and planners have long recognized the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as the vehicle to accomplish this objective.

The success of the Uniform Crime Reporting System during 2011 could not have been realized without the cooperation extended by each of the 542 law enforcement agencies of the State, the New Jersey Chiefs of Police Association, and the County Prosecutors Association.

It is in the interest of more effective law enforcement to the eight million residents of New Jersey that the forty-fifth annual report is submitted.

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





Section One

SYNOPSIS: UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

THE NEW JERSEY UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING SYSTEM

DEFINITION

The New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System is based upon the compilation, classification, and analysis of crime data reported by all New Jersey police agencies in accordance with the regulations prescribed by law.

DEVELOPMENT

The New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Law (N.J.S.A. 52:17 B-5.1 et. seq.) was enacted on May 16, 1966, and became effective January 1, 1967. Responsibility for the establishment, direction, control, and supervision of the Uniform Crime Reporting System was assigned to the State's Attorney General. The Attorney General authorized the New Jersey State Police to collect and collate the crime data received from law enforcement agencies within the state.

At the request of the Attorney General, the New Jersey State Police researched crime systems in operation throughout the nation in order to establish a firm foundation from which to grow. The most logical approach was the paralleling of the federal crime reporting system. There was a distinct need for a compatibility feature that would enhance both the state and federal systems through the data entry at both levels.

This compatibility has, as its nucleus, the standard classification of offenses established by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Regardless of the label placed on a particular offense in the various states' systems, *i.e.*, felony, misdemeanor, disorderly persons, if the incident meets the federal standard it will be reported as an offense.

The terms "crime" and "offense" are used interchangeably in this publication, and refer to an act committed in violation of a law which is reportable under the guidelines of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program.

The New Jersey State Chiefs of Police Association has served the program in an advisory capacity since 1966. The contributions of this association have proved valuable to the success of the program. This association works in close harmony with the State Police as a means of improving the quality of reporting through recommended program standards, policies and procedures.

COLLECTION OF CRIME DATA

As required by statute, all law enforcement agencies in the state submit monthly and annual summary crime reports to the program. During the year 2011, offense and arrest data were received from 470 full-time municipal police departments, one (1) part-time municipal police department, and the New Jersey State Police (acting as the reporting agent for the 77 municipalities without local police services). In addition to the 470 full-time municipal police departments there are 18 police departments contracted by other municipalities.

In addition to the above agencies, arrest data was received from the state's 21 prosecutors, sheriffs' departments, one (1) county police department, and three (3) county park police departments. In order to incorporate all New Jersey law enforcement agencies under the system, the ten (10) other state agencies with law enforcement responsibilities, excluding state police, as well as 14 college campus police departments were incorporated within the program. Collectively, a total of 542 law enforcement agencies submit the reports to the New Jersey State Police.

METHOD


A State of New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Guide has been distributed to all contributors. It outlines reporting procedures in detail, and is complete to the extent of providing examples and illustrations. Field representatives provide additional instruction and clarification when required.

All reported offenses are related to the municipality in which they occur rather than to the agency which may conduct the investigation. The clearance is credited to the municipality in which the offense occurred. Each contributing agency is responsible for compiling its own reports. Law enforcement agencies report the number of known offenses according to the following categories: Homicide (Murder and Manslaughter), Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson. The "Crime in New Jersey," and the Federal Bureau of Investigation's "Crime in the United States" publications exclude manslaughters, simple assaults, and arsons from the "Index" offenses. These are further referred to as "violent" and "nonviolent" crimes as

graphically illustrated in Section VII under "Municipal and County Offenses and Demographic Data," and Section II, "State Summary and Offense Analysis."

All reported offenses are compiled from a record of all criminal complaints received by police from victims or other sources, or discovered by the police during routine operations. Complaints determined to be unfounded are eliminated from this count. Analytical data pertaining to specific crime categories are also reported, *i.e.* total adult and juvenile arrests made during the month. Police killed or assaulted and arson data are also collected monthly. Police personnel information is submitted on an annual basis.

VERIFICATION PROCESSES

The uniformity and accuracy of data gathered from contributors must be safeguarded through various ways. Although guidelines and instructions are provided to each contributor, they are not the panaceas for the accuracy being sought.

The reports received by the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit are recorded and examined for mathematical accuracy and reasonableness of the interpretation of the offense classifications. Improper classifications, changes in reporting procedures, or actual change are identified in this manner. Errors of a minor nature are corrected by direct telephone contact with the contributors, while all other errors are resolved through a personal visit by a field representative to the reporting agency.

Further verification is accomplished through the analysis of statistical data accrued from the reports submitted. Fluctuations in crime rates noted from previous submissions are verified by the field representatives through their municipal counterpart.

FUNCTION

Police executives make use of this data in administrative, planning, and operational determinations for their respective jurisdictions. The State Police Uniform Crime Reporting Unit provides assistance to municipal police agencies through the individual analysis of statistics as they relate to specific crime problems within their jurisdiction. Police executives also use this data for identifying personnel and equipment needs. The Uniform Crime Reporting Program requirements not only have increased police efficiency in reporting and record keeping areas, but have helped police in their day to day operations.

Although the data collected on the offenses of manslaughter and simple assault are not presented in the annual report, they are required for the federal system. Data for these offenses is processed and provided for research purposes.

PROFILE OF NEW JERSEY

New Jersey is situated between the major industrial markets of New York and Philadelphia. The geographic location of the state has been a major factor in its growth and development. The many miles of interstate roadways within the state connect New Jersey directly with the neighboring states of New York, Pennsylvania, and Delaware. Additionally, New Jersey roadways accommodate large volumes of traffic as a corridor for commerce and travelers from throughout the United States.

The state is geographically composed of 21 counties which contain 565 incorporated municipalities. Nationally, New Jersey, although 46th in size, ranks tenth in population and first as the most densely populated state in the country. In addition to this density of 1,158.8 persons per square mile, New Jersey still has many miles of rural areas and sparsely settled communities. The areas of density are concentrated around the major urban centers and those venues most accessible for commuting.

STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL PROFILES

The presentation of state, county and municipal profiles in this section is offered for the purpose of projecting, for the consideration of the reader, a group of recognizable factors which may affect the amount and type of crime that occurs from community to community. Selection of the areas of information to be related to individual municipalities was based on the immediacy and completeness of data available.

Population statistics presented here, and throughout this publication, were obtained from the Department of Labor, Division of Labor Market and Demographic Research.

Character of municipalities by urban, suburban and rural classifications, and square miles, were initially compiled by the Department of Community Affairs, Division of State and Regional Planning, Bureau of Statewide Planning, and will continue to be used for comparative purposes. Following is a list of categories used and a description of each category.

• URBAN CENTER Densely populated with extensive development.

URBAN SUBURBAN
 Near an urban center but not as extremely developed and more residential areas.
 SUBURBAN
 Predominantly single family residential, within a short distance of an urban area.

• RURAL Scattered small communities and isolated single family dwellings.

• RURAL CENTER High density core area with surrounding rural municipalities.

Certain other socioeconomic factors present in varying degrees in all communities may have an influence on resulting crime rates. Obvious difficulties in the identification, documentation and measurement of these factors, however, precluded their application in this report.

Those factors presented were listed to affirm their existence within the county and community and to provide a base for consideration in the evaluation of that community's crime experience.

RESORT MUNICIPALITY CRIME RATES

On July 10, 1998, section 4 of P.L. 1966, c37(C.52:17B-5.4) was amended to require the Uniform Crime Report to include, in addition to the regular statistics, an alternative calculation that takes into account the seasonal population of resort municipalities.

The Department of Labor has been mandated to determine which municipalities qualify as resort municipalities and certify their annual mean population (which includes seasonal population estimates.)

CRIME FACTORS

In order to provide a meaningful statistical profile of crime within the State of New Jersey, each law enforcement agency must provide the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit with data that depicts specific crimes that are occurring within their jurisdiction. There is a need for compatibility with the National Uniform Crime Reporting System and, therefore, categories of offense classifications used within the state are identical with those of the National System. This results in equitable conclusions being drawn from the data submitted.

Reported Part 1 offenses and arrests are recorded in the municipality where they occurred, regardless of the outside investigative agency which may investigate, arrest, or otherwise dispose of the case.

The factors which influence crime rates are dependent upon characteristics of the community. When attempting to interpret the crime statistics presented herein, one should be aware of the social structure and factors that lead to or cause criminal behavior.

Crime rates in this publication are based on the stable population of the municipality. Municipalities that experience high population increases due to special events or commuters or with high seasonal populations, may indicate a higher crime rate per one thousand than may be normal for a municipality their size. A separate section provides statistics for resort municipalities using crime rates which include seasonal populations.

Set forth below are some factors which, by type and volume, will affect the crime rate that occurs from place to place:

- Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan areas of which it is a part.
- Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex and race.
- Economic status, including job availability, and mores of the population.
- Relative stability of population, including commuter, seasonal, and other transient types.
- Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.
- Cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
- Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
- Administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement.
- Policies of other components of the criminal justice system (*i.e.*, prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational).
- Crime reporting practices of the general citizenry.
- Attitudes of the public toward crime reporting.
- The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.
- Cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police agencies.

THE POLICE POINT OF VIEW

The New Jersey State Police Uniform Crime Reporting Unit surveyed various police agencies of the state, attempting to ascertain their opinion concerning factors contributing to the increase or decrease of specific crimes in their municipality. One of the goals of the Uniform Crime Reporting Unit is to assist police in reducing crime by first identifying its extent, type and location. The following viewpoints are offered with the expectation of reaching this goal.

ROBBERY

Decreases:

- More stringent sentencing requirements under the State Criminal Code.
- Advanced technology in communications has led to increased exchanges of information between police departments.
- Highly visible foot patrols being deployed in commercial areas and densely populated residential areas.
- Use of Anti-crime Unit in high robbery areas.

Increases:

- Resort areas have shown an increasing seasonal population.
- Our highly mobile society provides easy access to areas which were previously difficult to reach.

BURGLARY

Decreases:

- Better deployment of police personnel, such as highly visible foot patrols in high density crime areas, and increased patrols during probable time and at probable locations of burglaries.
- More stringent sentencing requirements under the State's Criminal Code have been a deterrent.
- Crime Prevention Programs are being stressed in many communities and citizens have been taking a more active part by reporting suspicious persons or circumstances.

Increases:

- Extreme increases in population in certain areas have led to new housing in suburban and rural areas.
- Husband and wife are both working; leaving homes frequently unoccupied for long periods of time.

LARCENY

Decreases:

- Public awareness programs contribute to the decrease in thefts from parked vehicles.
- Improved or additional lighting deters criminal acts from occurring in parking areas.
- "Safe Streets" Programs and Anti-crime Units have been established in many communities.

Increases:

- Shoplifting is a theft that police have little or no control over. Store security forces are under the control of the store administration, and their policies vary from strict enforcement, arrest and prosecution, to only a warning. Policy change has been directed toward prosecuting the offenders rather than warning them, causing to some extent an increase in the number of shoplifting offenses reported to the police.
- Certain types of property such as CD players, radar detectors and radios are popular and present resale opportunities.
- Youth gang activity on the increase resulting in thefts from motor vehicles.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Decreases:

- Stronger sentencing of career criminals has been effective.
- Modern ignition systems and anti-theft devices act as a deterrent.
- Better lighting in parking lots has helped decrease motor vehicle thefts.


Increases:

• The tremendous replacement cost of auto parts has contributed significantly to the increase in motor vehicle thefts for the purpose of auto parts resale.




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

CRIME INDEX - VOLUME/RATE

- There were 217,073 Index offenses in 2011, a 3 percent increase compared to 2010.
- The crime rate of the state is 24.7 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, an increase of 3 percent compared to 2010.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- July with 21,440 offenses reported, recorded the highest incidence of Crime Index offenses while February was the lowest with 13,000 offenses.
- The total value of property stolen amounted to \$390.3 million in 2011, an increase of 10 percent from 2010.
- Value of property recovered was \$105.9 million, resulting in a recovery rate of 27 percent.
- Stolen motor vehicles accounted for 40 percent of stolen property and 86 percent of the recovered property value.

CRIME INDEX ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- A total of 46,302 persons were arrested for Index offenses, which represents a 1 percent decrease compared to 2010.
- Adult Index arrests increased 3 percent and juvenile Index arrests decreased 15 percent.
- Crime Index arrests accounted for 14 percent of the total arrests in 2011.
- Males accounted for 69 percent of the Crime Index arrests and females accounted for 31 percent.
- Sixty percent of the Index arrests were white, 38 percent were black and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 19 percent of the arrests for Index offenses.
- Police cleared 20 percent of the Index offenses and juveniles accounted for 12 percent of those clearances.

Violent Crime Summary

This category consists of the following Index offenses: Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 27,173 violent crimes reported in 2011, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent compared to the violent crimes reported in 2010.
- Violent crimes accounted for 13 percent of the total Crime Index.
- The violent crime rate remained unchanged in 2011.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- The highest number of violent crimes were reported in July with 2,563 offenses while the lowest number was reported in February with 1,644 offenses.
- The total value of property stolen as a result of violent crime was \$13.9 million in 2011 an increase of 2 percent from 2010.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 12,065 violent crime arrests, a decrease of 6 percent compared to 2010.
- Violent crime arrests accounted for 26 percent of the Index arrests and 4 percent of the total arrests during the year.
- Adult arrests for violent crime decreased 5 percent and juvenile arrests decreased 13 percent.
- Adults accounted for 83 percent of the violent crime arrests while the remaining 17 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 81 percent of the Crime Index arrests and females accounted for 19 percent.
- Forty-nine percent of those arrests were white, 50 percent were black and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 23 percent of the arrests for violent crimes.
- Thirty-seven percent of violent crimes were cleared and juveniles accounted for 13 percent of those clearances.

NONVIOLENT CRIME SUMMARY

This category consists of the following Index offenses: Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 189,900 nonviolent crimes reported in 2011, a 3 percent increase compared to nonviolent crimes reported in 2010.
- Nonviolent crimes accounted for 87 percent of the total Crime Index.
- The nonviolent crime rate increased 3 percent to 21.6 victims for every 1,000 inhabitants in 2011.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- The highest number of nonviolent crimes were reported in July with 18,856 offenses while the lowest number was reported in February with 11,356 offenses.
- The total value of property stolen as a result of nonviolent crime was \$376.3 million in 2011 an increase of 10 percent from 2010.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- There were 34,235 nonviolent crime arrests, an increase of 1 percent when compared to 2010.
- Nonviolent crime arrests accounted for 74 percent of the Index arrests and 10 percent of the total arrests during the year.
- Juveniles were responsible for 17 percent of the nonviolent crime arrests and adults 83 percent.
- Adult arrests for nonviolent crimes increased 5 percent and juvenile arrests decreased 15 percent.

- Males represented 65 percent and females 35 percent of persons arrested for nonviolent crime.
- Sixty-four percent of all persons arrested for nonviolent crimes were white, 34 percent were black and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 17 percent of the arrests for nonviolent crimes.
- Seventeen percent of all nonviolent crimes reported were cleared in 2011, and juveniles accounted for 12 percent of those clearances.

TOTAL ARREST SUMMARY

- There were 342,944 persons arrested in 2011, which represents a 6 percent decrease compared to 2010.
- The arrest rate for 2011 decreased 5.8 percent with 39 persons arrested per every 1,000 inhabitants.
- Adult arrests decreased 5 percent to 308,804 and juvenile arrests decreased 16 percent to 34,140 in 2011.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent and juveniles 10 percent of the total state arrests.
- Persons under 21 years of age accounted for 23 percent of the total state arrests.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of the total persons arrested during the year.
- Sixty percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 38 percent were black and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 17 percent of the arrests.

POLICE OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED SUMMARY

- In 2011, the number of police officers that were feloniously killed in the line of duty was 1.
- In 2011, New Jersey reported 2,290 police officers assaulted in the line of duty.

CRIME IN NEW JERSEY, UNITED STATES AND THE NORTHEAST REGION

- Violent crime in New Jersey remained virtually unchanged and the Northeast Region decreased 1 percent compared to the previous year, while violent crime in the United States decreased by 4 percent overall.
- Nonviolent crime in New Jersey increased 3 percent, while the Northeast Region remained virtually unchanged compaired to the previous year. Nonviolent crime in the United States decreased 1 percent when compared to the 2010 figure.

MURDER

Definition:

Murder is defined as the unlawful killing of a human being with malice aforethought. Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is included. This Index offense is counted by police on the basis of their investigation without regard to findings of a court, jury or the decision of a prosecutor. Attempts to kill, are scored as aggravated assaults and not as murder. Suicides, accidental deaths, negligent manslaughters, and justifiable homicides are not counted, nor reflected in the murder classification.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 380 murders reported to law enforcement agencies of the state in 2011, a 2 percent increase compared to the 372 murders reported in 2010.
- Murders accounted for 0.18 percent of the reported index offenses, and 1 percent of the violent crime.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- The age group of 20-24 accounted for 23 percent of all murder victims.
- Firearms were used in 71 percent of the murders, knives or cutting instruments in 13 percent, blunt objects in 5 percent, and physical force in 4 percent.
- Twenty-one percent of the offenders were friends or acquaintances of the victim, while 11 percent were strangers, and 5 percent were relatives.
- Felony murders accounted for 14 percent of all murder circumstances. Robbery was the motive in 60 percent of the 53 felony murders.
- Sixty-three murders were recorded on Sunday for the high, while Tuesday was the lowest, with 50.
- July recorded the highest number of murders 53, while June recorded the lowest 22.
- Fifty percent of the murders occured on highways or streets, 16 percent in single family dwellings, and 8 percent in multi-family apartment dwellings.
- Forty domestic violence murders were recorded in 2011.
- Drug-related and/or gang related circumstances accounted for 6 percent (22) of all murders.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- A total of 204 persons were arrested for murder in 2011, a 21 percent decrease compared to 2010.
- Adult murder arrests decreased 18 percent (from 234 to 192) while juvenile arrests decreased 52 percent (from 25 to 12).
- Sixty-seven percent of persons arrested for murder were black and 31 percent were white.
- Hispanics accounted for 22 percent of the arrests.

- Fifty percent of the murders were cleared in 2011 (189 out of 380). Juveniles accounted for 2 percent of those cases cleared.
- Males accounted for 94 percent and females 6 percent of those arrested for murder.



MURDER BY DAY OF WEEK






MURDER DISTRIBUTION BY TYPE OF WEAPON - 2011



RELATIONSHIP OF MURDER VICTIMS TO OFFENDER





RAPE

Definition

Rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. All assaults and attempts to rape are counted, but carnal abuse, rape without force (statutory rape) and other sex offenses are not included.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 991 reported rapes in 2011, a 1 percent increase compared to the 985 in 2010.
- Rape accounted for an increase of less than one-half of one percent of the total Crime Index and 4 percent of all violent crimes.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- Ninety-three percent of the rapes were forcible, the remaining 7 percent were attempts to rape.
- The total value of property stolen as a result of Rape amounted to \$5,545.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- A total of 282 persons were arrested during 2011, a 13 percent decrease compared to 2010.
- Adult rape arrests decreased 8 percent, and juvenile arrests decreased 34 percent.
- Fifty-eight percent of the arrested perpetrators were white, 41 percent were black and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 38 percent of the arrests.
- Thirty-five percent of all persons arrested for rape were between 25 and 39.
- Thirty-five percent of rape cases were cleared in 2011. Juveniles accounted for 11 percent of those cases cleared.

ROBBERY

Definition

Robbery is defined as the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another, against his will, by violence or by putting him in fear. The element of personal confrontation is always present in this crime. Under the program, all assaults or attempts to rob are included.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 12,216 robbery offenses in 2011, an increase of 3 percent compared to 2010.
- Robbery accounted for 6 percent of the total Crime Index and 45 percent of all violent crimes.
- The robbery rate was 1.4 victims per 1,000 population.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS


- Highway robberies accounted for 64 percent of all reported robberies.
- Convenience store robberies increased 4 percent, while highway robberies increased 1 percent.
- The total value of property stolen during robberies amounted to \$13,909,383.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- A total of 3,622 persons were arrested for robbery in 2011, a 7 percent decrease compared to 2010.

CARJACKING HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of carjacking offense statistics for 2011 are listed below:

- There were 379 carjacking offenses reported to the police; which involved 414 victims, including passengers.
- Carjackings increased 6% when comparing 2011 to 2010 reported offenses.
- Twenty of the 566 municipalities in New Jersey reported carjackings.
- Firearms were involved in 77% (293) of all carjackings. Two percent (7) of the firearms used were assault firearms. Shootings were involved in 2 percent (9) of all carjackings.
- New Jersey registered vehicles represented 87% (330) of all carjackings. Mercedes Benz and Nissan (each with 35 offenses) represented 9% for each vehicle make, were the most frequently carjacked vehicle makes. The most frequently targeted vehicle year was 2007 with 12%(46).
- Sixty-six percent (252) of all carjacked vehicles were recovered. The average value of a carjacked motor vehicle was \$16,274.
- Carjackings occurred in a residential area 86% (326) of the time. The hours of darkness (6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.) accounted for 73% (275) of all carjackings.
- Nine percent (33) of all carjackings were witnessed.
- The most frequent victim age group was 25-29, which accounted for 17% (70) of the victim total (414). Sixty-six percent (274) of all victims were male. Fifty-five percent (228) of all victims were black.
- The total number of offenders was 724. Insufficient analysis information was supplied on 49% (355) of the offenders. Of all known offenders (369), 20-24 was the most frequent offender age group and accounted for 69% (254). Ninety-eight percent (362) of all known offenders were male. Ninety-one percent (336) of all known offenders were black.
- Juveniles accounted for 18% (2) of the total arrests for carjacking (11), while adults accounted for 82% (9).
- May had the highest number of offenses with 52, accounting for 14% of all carjacking offenses.
- Sunday recorded the highest number of offenses, accounting for 19% (72) of all carjackings.
- Region I, which consists of Essex, Hudson, and Union counties, accounted for 83% (316) of all carjackings.
- One murder was reported in 2011 as a result of carjacking.
- Two percent (9) of all carjackings (379) were cleared by arrest.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Definition

Aggravated assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do serious physical injury to another. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a firearm, knife, or other weapon is used which could result in serious personal injury if the crime was successfully completed.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 13,586 reported aggravated assaults in 2011, a decrease of 3 percent when compared to 2010.
- Aggravated assault accounted for 6 percent of the total Crime Index and 50 percent of all violent crimes.
- The rate for aggravated assault in 2011 decreased to 1.5 victims per 1000 population when compared to 2010.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- The categories of physical force (i.e. hands, fists, and feet) and other dangerous weapons (i.e. clubs, bricks, tire irons, etc.) were used in 60 percent of all reported aggravated assaults.
- Firearms were used in 18 percent of all aggravated assaults committed.



BURGLARY

Definition

Under this program, burglary is defined as an unlawful entry or attempted entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. Data collection for this offense is further categorized as forcible entry, unlawful entry (where no force is used) and attempted forcible entry.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 43,208 reported bulgary offenses in 2011, an 11 percent increase when compared to 2010.
- Burglary accounted for 20 percent of the total Crime Index and 23 percent of all nonviolent crimes.
- The burglary rate was 4.9 victims per 1,000 population.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- Sixty percent of all burglaries involved forcible entry, 31 percent were unlawful entry where no force was used and attempts to forcibly enter accounted for 10 percent in 2011.
- Residences were targets in 75 percent of the reported burglaries.
- Forty-seven percent of nonresidential burglaries are known to have occurred between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- Stolen property as a result of burglary statewide, amounted to \$96.8 million, for an average loss of \$2,240.
- The average loss as a result of residential burglaries was \$2,211 and of nonresidential burglaries was \$2,324.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- Burglary arrests increased 11 percent with 6,712 persons arrested.
- Adult arrests increased 13 percent, and juvenile arrests increased 1 percent.
- Males accounted for 86 percent, and females 14 percent of the burglary arrests.
- Juveniles accounted for 17 percent of all burglary arrests.
- Sixty-four percent of burglary arrests were white, 35 percent were black, and the remaining 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 19 percent of the arrests.
- Thirteen percent of the burglaries statewide were cleared and juveniles accounted for 10 percent of those clearances.

LARCENY-THEFT

Definition

The definition of larceny-theft, as provided under this program, is the taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership. All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocketpicking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, larcenies from motor vehicles, thefts or motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc., are included here. Embezzlement, unlawful conversions, larceny by bailee, frauds or bad checks are not included.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 129,269 larcenies reported in 2011, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent compared to 2010.
- Larceny accounted for 60 percent of the total Crime Index and 68 percent of all nonviolent crimes.
- The rate for larceny was 15 victims per 1,000 population.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- Theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories and thefts from motor vehicles collectively accounted for 30 percent of all larceny-theft reported.
- Shoplifting offenses decreased 1 percent when compared to 2010.
- Theft from buildings accounted for 17 percent of all larceny-thefts reported.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

- Larceny arrests decreased 1 percent in 2011 with 26,830 persons arrested.
- Adult arrests increased 4 percent, and juvenile arrests decreased 18 percent.
- Males accounted for 59 percent, and females 41 percent of the larceny arrests.
- Sixty-three percent of larceny arrests were white, 34 percent were black, and the remaining 2 percent were other races.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Definition:

In Uniform Crime Reporting, motor vehicle theft includes all thefts and attempted thefts of a motor vehicle. This includes the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle which is defined as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on the rails. This definition excludes taking a motor vehicle for temporary use, such as family situation, or unauthorized use by others having lawful access to the vehicle. The motor vehicle theft category includes the subheadings of autos, trucks and buses, and other vehicles (motorcycles, mopeds, etc.)

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 17,423 motor vehicle thefts reported in 2011, a 12 percent increase when compared to 2010.
- Motor vehicle theft accounted for 8 percent of the total Crime Index and 9 percent of all nonviolent crimes.
- The motor vehicle theft rate was 2 victims per 1000 population.


MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT VALUES

ARSON

Definition

Arson is defined by the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting program as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- There were 913 reportable arsons in 2011, which represents a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2010.
- The arson rate was 0.1 victims per 1,000 population.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- Fifty percent of arsons were structures, with single occupancy residences accounting for 21 percent.
- Mobile property, including motor vehicles, accounted for 26 percent of the arsons in the state.
- Other property (timber, crops, etc.) accounted for 24 percent of the reported arsons.
- Total value of property damage due to arson amounted to \$25.2 million, for an average loss of \$27,625.
- The average residential loss was \$40,961, while the average loss to industrial/commercial structures was \$63,576.
- The average loss to mobile property was \$9,336.

ARRESTS/CLEARANCES

Most frequent month

- Arson arrests numbered 265 in 2011 representing 10 percent decrease, compared to 2010.
- Adult arrests decreased 4 percent, and juvenile arrests decreased 15 percent.
- Males accounted for 83 percent, and females for 17 percent of the arson arrests.
- Juveniles accounted for 51 percent of all arsons arrests.
- Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested for arson were white, 23 percent were black, and the remaining 1 percent were other races.

ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

MANSLAUGHTER

Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 36 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for manslaughter during this year, an increase of 13 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 92 percent and juveniles accounted for 8 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 69 percent and females 31 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-three percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 44 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 22 percent of the arrests and 78 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

SIMPLE ASSAULT

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 24,916 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for simple assault during this year, a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 89 percent and juveniles accounted for 11 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females 28 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 34 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

ARSON

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling, house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc.

- There were 265 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for arson during this year, a decrease of 10 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 49 percent and juveniles accounted for 51 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 83 percent and females 17 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-six percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 23 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 19 percent of the arrests and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

Percent distribution may not add to 100 due to rounding.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 1,854 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for forgery and counterfeiting during this year, an increase of 7 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-seven percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 40 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

FRAUD

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 3,541 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for fraud during this year, a decrease of 14 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 36 percent were black, and 4 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 16 percent of the arrests and 84 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

EMBEZZLEMENT

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 211 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for embezzlement during this year, an increase of 23 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 58 percent and females 42 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-three percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 30 percent were black, and 7 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 19 percent of the arrests and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

STOLEN PROPERTY

(Buying Receiving, Possessing)

Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- There were 3,366 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for stolen property; buying, receiving, possessing, etc. during this year, an increase of 4 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 83 percent and juveniles accounted for 17 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 49 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

Criminal/Malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 5,272 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for criminal/malicious mischief during this year, a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 71 percent and juveniles accounted for 29 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 29 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statute controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 4,142 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for weapons; carrying, possessing, etc. during this year, a decrease of 6 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 77 percent and juveniles accounted for 23 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 88 percent and females 12 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-six percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 53 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 19 percent of the arrests and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc.

- There were 1,085 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for prostitution and commercialized vice during this year, a decrease of 27 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent and juveniles accounted for 1 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 29 percent and females 71 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-seven percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 34 percent were black, and 9 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

SEX OFFENSES

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 1,320 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for sex offenses (except forcible rape and prostitution) during this year, a decrease of 10 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 84 percent and juveniles accounted for 16 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females 9 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-nine percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 28 percent were black, and 4 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 32 percent of the arrests and 68 percent were non-Hispanic.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS


Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing/possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics: manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (Demerol, methadone).
- d. Other: dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).
- There were 47,168 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for drug abuse violations during this year, a decrease of 6 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent and juveniles accounted for 10 percent of the arrests.

- Forty-five percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 39 percent were black and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 15 percent of the arrests and 85 were non-Hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 78 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 22 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 30 percent of the possession/use category and 58 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 36 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

Opium of Cocame and their Derivatives (Morphine, Heroin, Codelne)







Definition

GAMBLING

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 103 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for gambling during this year, a decrease of 4 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 61 percent and juveniles accounted for 39 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 65 percent and females 35 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-four percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 17 percent were black, and 9 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 44 percent of the arrests and 56 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 14,612 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for offenses against family and children during this year, an increase of 10 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 100 percent and juveniles accounted for 0 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-five percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 44 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 12 percent of the arrests and 88 percent were non-Hispanic.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 26,496 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for driving under the influence during this year, a decrease of 1 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent and juveniles accounted for 1 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the arrests.
- Eighty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 13 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

LIQUOR LAWS

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of 'driving under the influence'.

- There were 7,365 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for liquor laws during this year, an increase of 6 percent
- Adults accounted for 70 percent and juveniles accounted for 30 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 69 percent and females 31 percent of the arrests.
- Eighty-nine percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 9 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 10 percent of the arrests and 90 percent were non-Hispanic.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 17,980 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for disorderly conduct during this year, a decrease of 11 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 84 percent and juveniles accounted for 16 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 77 percent and females 23 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-five percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 34 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

VAGRANCY

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

- There were 289 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for vagrancy during this year, a decrease of 66 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 88 percent and juveniles accounted for 12 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 86 percent and females 14 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-one percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, and 28 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 9 percent of the arrests and 91 percent were non-Hispanic.

Percent distribution may not add to 100 due to rounding.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Definition

Included in this category are all violation of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 131,904 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for all other offenses (except traffic) during this year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2010.
- Adults accounted for 96 percent and juveniles accounted for 4 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 76 percent and females 24 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-four percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 45 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 15 percent of the arrests and 85 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 1,795 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for curfew and loitering law violations during this year, a decrease of 48 percent when compared to 2010.
- Males accounted for 74 percent and females 26 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-seven percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, 43 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

Definition

RUNAWAYS

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 2,922 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for runaways during this year, a decrease of 17 percent when compared to 2010.
- Males accounted for 43 percent and females 57 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-two percent of total persons arrested in 2011 were white, and 58 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 29 percent of the arrests and 71 percent were non-Hispanic.

CRIME INDEX FOR POPULATION GROUPS - 2011


The presentation of crime statistics by population groups was made for the purpose of projecting, for consideration, the relative crime experience of communities of varying populations. Although the individual municipalities within the various groups may be geographically separated, their inclusion into a specific group was predicated by the similarity in population with the other municipalities within the group. Municipalities within the same group may differ widely when all factors are considered, but they do share the common bond of population size. The grouping of communities in this manner allows recognition of variances in the crime volumes, rates and clearances between the established groups.

CRIME IN THE CITIES

CRIME IN THE CITIES

This section deals with serious crimes reported in the large urban cities of the state. These cities represent 19 percent of the population and historically account for one third of the reported Crime Index of the state.

This analysis involves the latest ten-year period 2002-2011 and endeavors further to identify crime trends in these urban areas.

The cities included in this analysis were initially categorized as urban municipalities (*i.e.*, densely populated with extensive development) by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Division of State and Regional Planning, Bureau of Statewide Planning, and will continue to be used for comparative purposes.

The criteria used in the selection of these cities were (1) classified as urban character and (2) have a population of 50,000 or more inhabitants.

For further comparative analysis, the urban cities were subdivided into two distinct groupings.

Group number one consisted of the state's six largest urban centers with populations of 80,000 or over and is categorized as "Major Urban."

The second group included the "Major Urban" and the additional urban communities with populations of 50,000 or more inhabitants, and is referred to as the "Urban 15."

Percent Change

- During the ten-year period 2002/2011, the Crime Index in New Jersey has decreased 17 percent, while the "Urban 15" cities decreased 26 and the six Major Urban cities decreased 21 percent.
- Violent crime in the state decreased 16 percent, the 15 Urban cities decreased 16 percent, while the six Major Urban cities experienced an increase of 2 percent.
- Nonviolent crime in the state decreased 17 percent, the "Urban 15" decreased 29 percent and the six "Major Urban" decreased 27 percent.

Distribution:

- Six major urban centers—Camden, Newark, Jersey City, Trenton, Paterson and Elizabeth—collectively represent 11 percent of New Jersey's total population. These same urban centers, during the period 2002 through 2011 accounted for 21 percent of the state's total crime.
- "Major Urban" centers from 2002 through 2011 accounted for 37 percent of all violent crime and 19 percent of the nonviolent crimes in the entire state.
- The 15 urban municipalities represent 18 percent of the state's total population.
- "Urban 15" municipalities accounted for 32 percent of New Jersey's total Crime Index. Violent crime was 52 percent of the state total, while nonviolent crime was 29 percent of the state total during this ten-year period.
- Sixty-six percent of all reported murders occurred in the "Urban 15" cities during this ten-year period.

STREET CRIME

There has never been a clear-cut definition for street crime within the criminal justice system. The nation's clearinghouse for the collection and dissemination of criminal statistics, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, has no criteria in the categorization of specific crimes to be designated or defined as "street crimes." More and more, this media term has been confused with the violent crime group of murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

Although any particular crime can and does occur on the street, this analysis, because of reporting constraints within the Uniform Crime Reporting System, is limited to defining street crimes as those offenses which occur, or are most likely to occur, on streets, highways, parking lots, etc.. These crimes include highway robbery, purse-snatching, theft from autos, theft of auto parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, and motor vehicle thefts. All are crimes against property and only one, highway robbery, falls in the violent crime group.

- During the ten-year period 2002-2011, the "Urban 15" cities accounted for 40.3 percent of the street crimes in the state.
- Sixty-nine percent of all highway robberies in the state occurred in the "Urban 15" cities during the ten-year period.
- Fifty-five percent of all motor vehicle thefts during the survey span occurred in these 15 urban municipalities.
- Twenty-nine percent of all purse-snatchings during the survey span were perpetrated in the "Urban 15" cities.
- In 2011, thefts from motor vehicles, theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories and larceny of bikes were at their lowest levels in this ten-year period.

Section Eight

RESORT MUNICIPALITIES

As required by P.L. 1998, c. 50, annual mean population estimates for resort municipalities in New Jersey have been used in the preparation of per capita crime statistics.

These estimates were prepared based upon the methodology prescribed in P.L. 1998, c. 50 using the latest available municipality estimates of year-round population from the U.S. Bureau of the Census. Please note that these resort population estimates should only be used for crime statistics purposes. While they fulfill the requirements of the law, the seasonal components of these estimates are not a complete measure of seasonal population because they include only those living in rental housing units or in vacant year-round housing. Not counted are the many day visitors and persons who occupy campgrounds, hotels, motels or bed and breakfast establishments or who stay with friends or relatives.





POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program of New Jersey incorporates the collection of pertinent data relating to the police of the state. Information regarding police employees strength and trends are discussed in this section.

Individual listings of full-time state, county, university and college police departments are shown in tables within this section Listings of municipal police departments will be found in Section VII.

The determination of police strength for any given area or municipality should be subject for serious consideration. Such consideration, however, should be based on the numerous factors which create the need for police services. For example, the increase need for police services in a municipality which has highly mobile or seasonal population differs from a municipality which has a relative stable population. Some other factors, discussed elsewhere in this publication, relate to size, density of population, geographic location character, and proximity to metropolitan areas. The tables and charts shown in this section should not be interpreted as recommended strength for any given municipality.

TOTAL POLICE EMPLOYEES

Total police employees are defined as the total number of full-time police officers and civilian police employees (clerks, dispatches, mechanics, etc.) employed by all law enforcement agencies in the state.

- During 2011 there were 45,986 full-time police employees in New Jersey. This represents a decrease of 13 percent when compare the 2010.
- The number of full-time police officers decreased 9 percent, from 38,880 in 2010 to 35,236 in 2011.
- The number of full-time civilian employees decreased 16 percent, from 12,798 in 2010 to 10,750 in 2011.
- Seventy-seven percent were sworn officers and the remaining 23 percent were civilian employees.

MUNICIPAL POLICE EMPLOYEES

This category consists of the number of police employees, including civilian personnel, employed full-time by the municipalities of the state.

- During 2011 there were 23,181 municipal police employees, a decrease of 6 percent when compared to the 24,607 in 2010.
- For every 1,000 inhabitants of the state there were 3.0 municipal police employees.
- Monmouth County reported the largest increase in municipal police employees, an increase of 5 percent (44 employees).
- Cape May and Atlantic Counties recorded the highest police employee rate; 4.2, 3.9 per 1,000 population; (this rate is computed c the static population and does not take into account the large influx of seasonal and recreational population).
- Hunterdon County recorded the lowest police employee rate 1.4 per 1000 population.

MUNICIPAL CIVILIAN POLICE EMPLOYEES

The personnel of each department differ as to the demands and responsibilities placed before them. Many police officers are fully occupied with clerical tasks and are not free to perform active police duties. Employing civilians in police departments to perform clerical duties is in line with the thinking of many police administrators who recommended the use of civilians in this capacity, thus freeing the sworn personnel for actual police services.

- There were 3,815 municipal civilian police employees in 2011, a decrease of 16 percent when compared to the 4,526 in 2010.
- Sixteen percent of all municipal police employees were civilians.

MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS

This includes the number of sworn police officers employed full-time by the municipalities of the state. The police employee rate per 1,000 population presented here should not be construed as recommended ratios. The determination of police srength for any municipality should be based on the numerous factors that create the need for police services. These factors such as crime, vary in type and degree from place to place. Some examples are: seasonal population, geographic location, density and composition of the population.

- There were 19,366 full-time municipal police officers in 2011; this represents a decrease of 6 percent when compared to the 20,552 full-time municipal police officers in 2010.
- The number of full-time police officers was calculated at 2.2 per 1,000 population; a decrease of less than one-half of one percent when compared to 2010.
- Sworn officers represented 84 of all municipal police employees.
- Collectively, all 21 counties in New Jersey experienced a decrease of municipal police officers in 2011.
- The largest numerical decrease occurred in Essex County, a decrease of (302) municipal police officers, or 11 percent.
- Essex County and Cape May County, with 3.2 police officers per 1000, inhabitants, recorded the highest rate of full-time municipal police officers.
- Sussex County recorded the lowest rate of full-time municipal officers with 1.2 police officers per 1,000 population.

OTHER POLICE (State Agencies)

In addition to the State Police, there are ten other state agencies reporting to the system. These agencies consist of: NJ Forest Fire Service, Division of Parks & Forestry, Department of Corrections, Department of Human Services, Division of Criminal Justice, Division of Fish and Wildlife, Office of Weights and Measures, Palisades Interstate Parkway, Port Authority NY/NJ, NJ Transit Police, and New Jersey State Park Police. No rates were computed due to the variations in the types of police services rendered, and their statewide jurisdictions.

- Together, these agencies reported a total of 10,066 full-time employees; a decrease of 10 percent compared to the 11,115 police employees in 2010.
- There were 7,471 sworn police officers in 2011, a decrease of 7 percent compared to the 7,958 in 2010.
- Seventy-four percent were sworn personnel, while the remaining 26 percent were civilians.

COUNTY POLICE, SHERIFFS AND PROSECUTORS

The functions of county law enforcement vary widely throughout the state. The operation of one sheriff's department may be limited exclusively to civil areas and the administration of the county jail, or they may be actively involved in investigating criminal matters throughout the county.

County police departments are varied in their activities in that some are responsible for enforcement throughout the county, while others may have as their primary mission the policing of county parklands. The responsibilities of county prosecutors' officers include criminal investigations, trial preparation, court presentation and special probes. Because of the difference in the types of police services rendered, rates for county law enforcement agencies are not presented here.

- County law enforcement agencies reported a total of 8,230 full-time police employees in 2011; a decrease of 5 percent compared to 8,656 in 2010.
- There were 5,381 full-time sworn police officers employed by county agencies in 2011. This represents a decrease of 5 percent compared to 5,625 in 2010.
- County police agencies reported 2,849 civilian police employees in 2011; a decrease of 6 percent compared to 3031 civilian employees in 2010.
- Sworn personnel accounted for 65 percent while the remaining 35 percent were civilians.

STATE POLICE

The New Jersey State Police is empowered to provide all phases of law enforcement throughout the state. It also renders, upon request, police services to all the law enforcement agencies in the state. No rates are used due to the variations in the nature and extent of the police services performed by the State Police.

- The New Jersey State Police reported 4,004 full-time police employees; a decrease of 6 percent compared to 4,233 in 2010.
- State Police employed 2,741 officers in 2011, a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 3,040 in 2010.
- The State Police reported 1,263 civilian employees in 2011; a decrease of 3 percent over the 1,297 in 2010.
- Sworn personnel accounted for 68 percent and civilians represented 32 percent of the total State Police employees.

Section Ten

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED & ASSAULTED SUMMARY

POLICE OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED

The killing or assault of a police officer has a harmful effect on society that reaches far beyond the overt act. Such occurrences constitute an immediate threat to the well-being of the community and serious breach of the internal security of the country. Today a young person who considers a career in law enforcement must also consider the very strong possibility of being killed or assaulted by a member of the very same society they are sworn to protect. This deplorable situation should be a subject of serious concern, for in truth, an attack on a police officer is an attack on society. The violence directed against law enforcement officers acting in the line of duty is clearly demonstrated by the following information.

POLICE FELONIOUSLY KILLED

VOLUME/TREND

- In 2011, one police officer was feloniously killed while in the performance of duty.
- On January 14, 2011, Lakewood Township Police Officer Christopher Matlosz observed a suspicious subject in a condominium complex. The subject departs the scene but is again located approximately two blocks from the condominium complex in a single family residential area walking. The officer confronts the walking subject and initiates a conversation through the police vehicle's open driver's side window. At this time the subject is observed to make a comment, and then reach into his pocket and draws a handgun. He fires the weapon three times fatally wounding Officer Matlosz. Investigation reveals that the assailant Jahmell Crockam, at the time of the attack, had an active warrant on him for illegal weapons possession. Two days later Crocham was arrested in Camden, New Jersey.

ASSAULTS ON POLICE OFFICERS

Police assault statistics are important to the police administrator who attempts to identify the causative factors of this type of criminal activity. Many factors contribute to police assaults, and circumstances vary from place to place. Identifying specific reasons for these assaults is therefore extremely difficult. The following information illustrates the frequency of these events, and any attempt at analysis of these assaults should include consideration of the unique variables present in each jurisdiction. Due to the broad field of services performed by many state and county police agencies, no assault rates are computed for total police officers.

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

• There were 2,290 police officers assaulted in 2011, a decrease of 5 percent when compared to 2010.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS

- Twenty-five percent (572) of the officers assaulted sustained injury.
- Physical Force, such as hands, fists and feet were used in 87 percent (1,996) of all police assaults.
- Thirty-two percent of police assaults occurred when officers responded to disturbance calls.
- Twelve percent of the assaults on police officers occurred during the 2-hour period of 10:00 p.m. to 12 midnight.

CLEARANCES

The police of New Jersey were successful in clearing in 82 percent of the assaults directed at them.

ASSAULTS ON MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS

VOLUME/RATE/TREND

- A total 1,973 of municipal police officers were assaulted during 2011, decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2010.
- The assault rate, for every 100 municipal officers, was 10.2, a 5.6 percent decrease compared to 2010.

ADDITIONAL ANALYSIS


- Twenty-two percent of the municipal officers assaulted sustained injury.
- Physical Force, such as hands, fists and feet were used in 88 percent (1,731) of all police assaults.
- Thirty-six percent of the municipal police assaults occured when officers responded to disturbance calls.
- Attempting Other Arrests accounted for 16 percent of the municipal police assaults.

OTHER POLICE OFFICERS ASSAULTED

The following law enforcement agencies are dealt with separately and are not included when computing municipal assault rates; the services performed by these agencies vary greatly from the functions of municipal police agencies.


- County law enforcement agencies reported 57 police officers assaulted with 26 sustaining injury.
- The New Jersey State Police reported 65 police officers assaulted with 17 sustaining injury.
- Other state agencies with police powers reported 180 police officers assaulted with 90 sustaining injury.
- University and college police agencies reported 15 police officers assaulted with 6 sustaining injury.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ADULT For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, a person aged 18 or over.

AMERICAN INDIAN A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America, and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

or **ALASKAN NATIVE**

ARREST RATE The number of arrests for Part I and Part II offenses for each unit of population,

generally per 1,000.

ASIAN or

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, **PACIFIC ISLANDER** the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example: China,

India, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

BLACK A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa, characterized by

dark skin pigmentation.

CLEARANCE For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, the solution to a particular crime, usually by

the arrest of the offender.

CLEARED BY ARREST For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, an offense is cleared when the offender has

been identified, sufficient evidence has been obtained to formally charge and the

offender has been ordered to appear in court.

CRIME INDEX The total of the seven major offenses used to measure the extent, fluctuation and

> distribution of crime in a geographical area. The following crimes make up the index: Murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle

theft: these offenses are referred to as Index offenses.

CRIME RATE The number of Index offenses reported for each unit of population per 1,000.

CRIMES AGAINST

PERSONS

Consists of the following Index offenses: Murder, rape, and aggravated assault.

CRIMES AGAINST

PROPERTY

Consists of the following Index offenses: Robbery, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor

vehicle theft.

DAY For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, the hours from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

ETHNIC ORIGIN Having or originating from linguistic or cultural ties with a specific group.

EXCEPTIONAL CLEARANCE For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, an offense is cleared exceptionally when an

offender has been identified or located and sufficient evidence to charge has been obtained, but there is some reason beyond police control that prohibits the offender

from being brought before the court.

HIERARCHY RULE For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, each crime or attempted crime is counted in

> only one offense category. If several offenses are committed, simply glance down the list of Part I offenses and stop at the first offense recognized from the facts given; this

offense is the correct classification for this criminal activity.

HISPANIC A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish

culture or origin, regardless of race.

JUVENILE For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, a person under the age of 18.

JUVENILE CLEARANCE Those crimes where the offenders are identified as juveniles. **NIGHT** For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, the hours from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

NONVIOLENT CRIME Consists of the following Index offenses: Burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle

theft.

POPULATION Is the year-round population of the municipality shown in the most recent State

population estimates published by the Department of Labor, except that in the year of

promulgation of a Federal decennial census, the census figures shall be used.

RESORT MUNICIPALITY Is a municipality which, because of its recreational, entertainment or amusement

characteristics or facilities or its close proximity to such characteristics or facilities, experiences a total increase during the seasonal period in the number of persons

temporarily resident therein of 25 percent or more of its population.

SEASONAL POPULATION Is the average of the estimated number of persons temporarily resident in the

municipality during the three consecutive months when the temporary population is

greatest.

TEMPORARY RESIDENT Means the occupying for any period of time during the seasonal period by any person

not counted as a resident of the municipality for population purposes of an

accommodation in a rented residential unit or vacation home.

UNFOUNDED Classification of reported crimes that are found to be false or baseless.

VIOLENT CRIME Consists of the following Index offenses: Murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated

assault.

WHITE A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the

Middle East.

CALCULATIONS OF RATES AND TRENDS

1. **Crime Rate per 1,000 inhabitants:** This represents the number of Index offenses per 1,000 inhabitants. For example: What is the crime rate for a municipality with 513 Index offenses (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft), with a population of 8,280?

513 (Index offenses) \div 8,280 (population) = .061957 x 1,000 = 62.0 (crime per 1,000 inhabitants)

2. **Crime Trend:** A crime trend shows the extent to which crime increased or decreased. This is done by comparing a period of the current year with the same period of a previous year. For example: A municipality experienced 264 Index offenses in a previous year and 513 Index offenses in the current year. What is the percent of the increase?

513 (current year Index offenses) -264 (previous year Index offenses) =249 (numerical increase) $\div 264$ (previous year) $=.943 \times 100 = +94\%$ (percent change)

NOTE: If there were more Index offenses in a previous year than in the current year, we would have a percentage decrease.

3. Number of Police personnel per 1,000 inhabitants: This is calculated in the same manner as a crime rate. For example: A municipality with a population of 8,280 and 28 police personnel. How many officers are there per 1,000 population?

28 (police personnel) \div 8,280 (population) = .00338 x 1,000 = 3.4 (police personnel per 1,000 inhabitants)

NOTE: This formula can be applied to either total police personnel or just police officers per 1,000 inhabitants.

4. Police Assaulted Rate: This is calculated at a rate per 100 police officers. For example: A municipality with 25 officers had five of them assaulted during the month. What is the police assaulted rate?

5 (police officers assaulted) \div 25 (police officers) = .2 x 100 = 20 (police assaulted per 100 officers)

5. Clearance Rate: This refers to the percent of Index offenses cleared (solved), over a specific period of time. For example: A municipality with 513 Index offenses in a chosen time frame, cleared 95 of these offenses. What is the clearance rate?

95 (Index offenses cleared) \div 513 (Index offenses) = .185 x 100 = 18.5 (percent cleared)

6. Annual Mean Population: Is determined for each municipality designated a resort municipality by use of the following formula:

$$AMP = \frac{12P + 3SP}{12}$$

Where **AMP** equals Annual Mean Population; **P** equals Population; **SP** equals Seasonal Population.
