### **Program Summary**

This presentation will discuss the goals, investigation, and prosecution of civil forfeitures. Participants will learn how to identify the proceeds and instrumentalities of criminal activity and develop probable cause to seize it. Finally, there will be an overview of forfeiture litigation from filing a complaint to obtaining a judgment.

#### Who Should Attend?

This presentation is intended for those that deal with civil forfeiture; however others may find this presentation of interest.

## Who Is the Faculty?

**DAG Derek Miller** is a member of the Division of Criminal Justice Financial Crimes Bureau. DAG Miller prosecuted civil forfeitures for five years and has successfully seized and forfeited more than \$20 million dollars in white-collar crime, official corruption, and racketeering cases. He has also prosecuted conspiracy, fraud, money laundering, identity theft, bankruptcy fraud, and other crimes for the State. DAG Miller received his B.A. from Rutgers University - New Brunswick and his J.D. from Rutgers School of Law - Camden.

# How Do I Register?

### **State Employees**

## Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: <a href="mailto:njagai@njoag.gov">njagai@njoag.gov</a> for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/">http://www.state.nj.us/</a> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/">http://www.state.nj.us/</a>. Upon opening the AGAI Course Registration System home page, you will see the Create Account link in the Login Box.
