Program Summary

Those who do not learn from the mistakes of the past are doomed to repeat it. This course will examine 50 reversals from the 2017 to 2018 appellate court terms and categorize the reasons for the courts' decisions. The presenter will highlight common issues and problems and put some numbers to the most common reasons for reversal in order to avoid similar results in future cases.

Eligibility

Registration for this program is limited to deputy and assistant attorneys general in the Divisions of Criminal Justice and Law, and assistant prosecutors.

Faculty

Ian Kennedy is an Assistant Prosecutor in the Appellate Section of the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office. Prior to joining the BCPO, he was a Deputy Attorney General in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau and worked in private practice for a short period. In these positions, he briefed and argued cases in the Law Division, Appellate Division, and Supreme Court of New Jersey, in addition to litigating cases before the United States District Court. AP Kennedy served as a law clerk in the Appellate Division for the Honorable Carmen Messano, P.J.A.D. He received his B.A. from Union College, magna cum laude, and his J.D. from Boston College Law School, magna cum laude.
