Program Summary

This program combines the great tradition of the American lawyer as poet advocate with the work of one of the most celebrated poet advocates of our time, Bruce Springsteen, as the program digs into the ethical and professional obligations of the attorney to the client, the court, the public, and other lawyers. Like the poet, the American lawyer is called to distinguish both the "flesh" from the "fantasy", and the important from the trivial, and he must do so not only for his client, but also in his own life and work. So rev your engine, make your stand, and get ready "to case the promised land" as we consider the intersection of law and life as captured in the music of the man America refers to as "the Boss."

Eligibility

Faculty

Professor Greg Randall Lee teaches Constitutional Law, Professional Responsibility, and Torts at the Widener University Commonwealth School of Law in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. He has been selected as Widener's Outstanding Law Professor by both students and alumni. Professor Lee has served as the chair of both the Association of American Law Schools' Section on Professional Responsibility and the law school subcommittee of the Pennsylvania Bar Association Professionalism Committee. He has given over three hundred talks in a host of different forums

and published over 50 law-related articles. He holds an undergraduate degree from Butler University and a J.D. from Harvard Law School.
