Program Summary

This program will focus on how to draft discovery requests and respond to discovery in State Police civil rights and Department of Correction cases. The presenter will discuss various privileges asserted in these matters, the assertion of confidentiality of certain matters, and court orders required to produce materials.

Faculty

DAG Michael Vomacka is an Assistant Section Chief in the Law Enforcement and Corrections Section of the Division of Law. He supervises trial attorneys and handles the defense of complex civil rights, tort, and other claims against State entities. Prior to joining the Division of Law, DAG Vomacka clerked in Passaic County, handled personal injury and product liability civil litigation cases in private practice, and prosecuted misdemeanor and felony cases as an Assistant District Attorney in Texas, where he handled thirty criminal trials. He holds an undergraduate degree from Oberlin College and a J.D. from the Georgetown University Law Center.
