NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULES

Date of Proposal: September 19, 2016

Proposal Number: PRN 2016-152

Proposal Description:

Pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 13:69D-1.54*, Gaming vouchers; procedures for issuance and redemption; redemption of coupons through a gaming voucher system, a casino licensee may issue and redeem gaming vouchers at cashiering locations, slot machines, or electronic table games, if such games are connected to a computerized gaming voucher system approved by the Division. *N.J.A.C. 13:69D-1.54* also regulates that all gaming vouchers shall expire one year from the date of issuance, with the exception of cashier generated gaming vouchers. A casino licensee may restrict gaming voucher redemption locations based on specific voucher amounts, or after a specific amount of time in the casino licensee's internal controls, provided that adequate written notice of the restrictions is provided to the patrons.

The proposed amendment to *N.J.A.C. 13:69D-1.54(d)* includes cashier generated gaming vouchers under the rule that all gaming vouchers shall expire one year from the date of issuance, provided that nothing shall preclude casino licensees from restricting the gaming voucher redemption locations based on specific voucher amounts, or after a specific amount of time in the casino licensee's internal controls, provided that adequate written notice of the restrictions is provided to the patrons.
