<u>DUTIES</u>: Under general supervision, will be responsible for the physical design, coding, testing, and implementation of databases including the product development life cycle, quality assurance and maintenance; evaluate database system security features and identify potential weaknesses; develop queries which can be used for investigation and resolution of patron complaints; specify requirements for field trial monitoring.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with an Associate's degree in Computer Science. A Bachelor's degree in Computer Science or Computer Engineering is preferred. Additionally, possession of twelve (12) credits in IT/Computer Science is preferred.

EXPERIENCE: Three (3) years of systems analysis, applications programming, design, systems programming and/or database administration experience in the data processing field of which one (1) year shall have been in database design, analysis, and or implementation. Experience trouble shooting and designing secure databases or software is preferred.

<u>NOTE</u>: A general Bachelor's degree can be substituted for one (1) year of experience in systems analysis, application programming, design, systems programming, and/or database administration.

<u>NOTE</u>: A specific Bachelor's degree in Computer Science can be substituted for two (2) years of experience in systems analysis, application programming, design, systems programming, and/or database administration.

<u>NOTE</u>: A Master's degree in Computer Science may be substituted for three (3) years of experience in systems analysis, application programming, design, systems programming, and/or database administration.

SPECIAL NOTE SUBSTITUTING EXPERIENCE FOR EDUCATION: Experience in the study of work methods and processes, the analysis of varied types of data, the design and preparation of systems and programs, the operation of multiprogramming computer systems and work in the data processing support areas of input/output control or reliability support may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis with one (1) year of experience being equal to thirty (30) semester hour credits.

<u>NOTE</u>: Formal training in data processing received at an accredited institution may be submitted with your application for an evaluation by the Department of Personnel for possible credit. These training courses will be examined to see how they compare, both in hours and content, to college courses to which they equate. In-house training courses will not be accepted as meeting this criterion; thus, they will not be evaluated.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
