PLACEMENT ON
EXCLUSION LIST

Petitioner, State of New Jersey, Department of Law and Public Safety,
Division of Gaming Enforcement ("Division"), located at 1300 Atlantic Avenue, Atlantic City,
New Jersey, 08401 says:

1. Respondent, BRIAN DETLEF ("Detlef"), is a New Jersey resident, residing at [REDACTED]

2. N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)3 authorizes the exclusion of

any person who has been convicted of a criminal offense.... punishable by more than six months in prison and whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interests of the State of New Jersey and of license gaming therein.

3. N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4 authorizes the exclusion of

any person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein, including

iii Persons who pose a threat to the safety of the patrons or employee sof a casino licensee

iv. Persons with a documented history of conduct involving the undue disruption of the gaming operations of casino licensees

4. Between January 5, 2010 and January 2, 2012, Detlef was arrested and convicted of Criminal Trespass (24 occasions), contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3, and Disorderly Conduct (1 occasion), contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:33-2a(1). All of the matters set forth in this paragraph occurred in within licensed casino facilities in Atlantic City and all were adjudicated before the Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to fines and other penalties, these convictions resulted in Detlef being barred for a period of two years from

Trump Taj Majal Casino Resort, Bally's Atlantic City, Trump Plaza Hotel and Casino, Resort's Atlantic City, Caesar's Atlantic City, and the Tropicana Casino and Resort.

5. On August 2, 2011, Detlef was charged in Atlantic County Indictment 11-08-1853-C with Possession of CDS (cocaine), third degree, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10a(1). On February 10, 2012, upon his plea, Detlef was convicted of this offense, and sentenced to a 5 year term of probation.

6. On April 15, 2010, Detlef was charged in Atlantic County Indictment 10-04-0889-C with Possession of CDS (cocaine), third degree, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10a(1), and another related offense. On June 13, 2011, upon his plea, Detlef was convicted of this offense. The other remaining charge was dismissed. Detlef was sentenced to a 5 year term of probation.

7. On March 23, 2010, Detlef was charged in Atlantic County Indictment 10-03-0676-C with Possession of CDS (cocaine), third degree, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10a(1). On June 13, 2011, upon his plea, Detlef was convicted of this offense, and sentenced to a 5 year term of probation.

8. Between January, 2010, and January, 2012, Detlef was present in several Atlantic City casino facilities including Trump Taj Majal Casino Resort, Bally's Atlantic City, Trump Plaza Hotel and Casino, Resort's Atlantic City, Caesar's Atlantic City, and the Tropicana Casino and Resort.

9. Based on information contained in Paragraphs 1 through 7 of this Petition, Detlef is a person who has been convicted of a criminal offense punishable by more than six months in prison and whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interests of the State of New Jersey and of licensed gaming therein and should be excluded from casino premises pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)3.

10. Based on information contained in Paragraphs 1 through 7 of this Petition, Detlef is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interests of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein and should be excluded from casino premises pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner demands the following relief against Respondent, Brian Detlef:

A. Judgment that Respondent, Brian Detlef, is a person who has been convicted of an offense punishable by more than 6 months in jail and whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or of licensed gaming therein, within the meaning of N.J.A.C.13:69G-1.3(a)3;


B. Judgment that Respondent, Brian Detlef, is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or of licensed gaming therein, within the meaning of N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4;

C. Judgment entering a final order placing Respondent, Brian Detlef, on the exclusion list pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-71 and N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)3; 13:69G-1.3(a)4 and,

D. Judgment for such other and further relief as the Director may deem just and appropriate under the circumstances.
