2. N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4 authorizes the exclusion of

any person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein, including

iii Persons who pose a threat to the safety of the patrons or employee sof a casino licensee

iv. Persons with a documented history of conduct involving the undue disruption of the gaming operations of casino licensees

3. On March 21, 2013, Choe was indicted in Atlantic County No. 13-03-0884-CCP for Theft of Lost Property, third degree, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:20-6. Choe allegedly took 2 \$1,000 gaming cheques from a roulette table at Borgata Hotel Casino and Spa that had been left at the table by a patron. On May 2, 2013, Choe failed to appear in court, and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

4. Based on information contained in Paragraphs 1 through 3 of this petition, Choe is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interests of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein and should be excluded from casino premises pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner demands the following relief against Respondent, Sung Q. Choe, a/k/a Sung I. Choe,:

A. Judgment that the Respondent, Sung Q. Choe, a/k/a Sung I. Choe, is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or of licensed gaming therein, within the meaning of N.J.A.C.13:69G-1.3(a)4;

B. Judgment entering a Final Order placing Respondent, Sung Q. Choe, a/k/a Sung I. Choe, on the exclusion list pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-71(l) and 13:69G-1.3(a)4; and,

C. Judgment for such other and further relief as the Director may deem just and appropriate under the circumstances.
