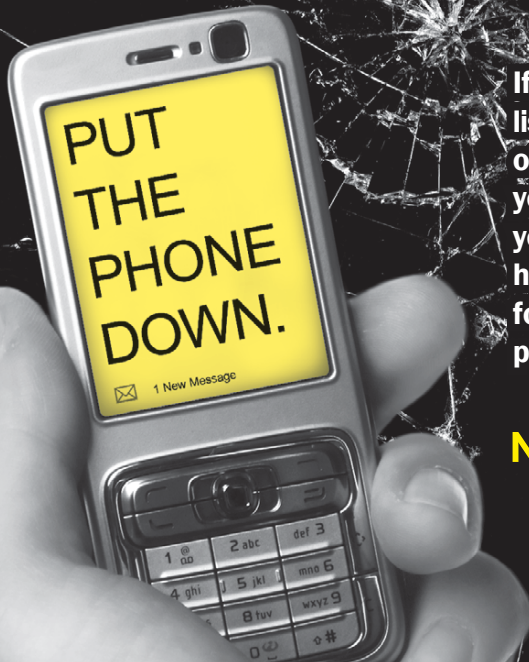

If you talk on a hand-held cell phone or text message while driving, listen up! New Jersey's hand-held cell phone law will become a primary offense on March 1, 2008. That means if a police officer observes you talking on a hand-held cell phone or texting while driving, you'll be stopped, ticketed and assessed a \$100 fine. Keeping both hands on the wheel and your mind focused on driving is essential for everyone's safety. If you must use your cell phone while driving, pull over to a safe place or use a hands-free device.
