INDICTMENT

NICHOLAS MARTINEZ) also known as KING JUNE)

The Grand Jurors of and for the State of New Jersey, upon their oaths, present that:

COUNT ONE

(Conspiracy - Second Degree)

NICHOLAS MARTINEZ

between on or about February 27, 2002, and on or about

February 28, 2002, at the City of Newark, in the County of Essex,

elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, with the

purpose of promoting or facilitating the commission of the crimes

of robbery and theft by extortion, did agree together and with

other persons whose identities are known and unknown to the Grand

Jurors, including Adam Roman, who are named as coconspirators but

not as defendants in this Indictment, that:

- A. One or more of them would engage in conduct which would constitute the aforesaid crimes, or
- B. One or more of them would aid in the planning, solicitation or commission of said crimes, that is:

- 1. While in the course of committing a theft, purposely to use force upon Maria Correia or purposely put her in fear of immediate bodily injury, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:15-la; and
- 2. Purposely and unlawfully to obtain the property of another by extortion, that is, by purposely threatening bodily injury to Maria Correia, or by confining her, until she turned over property belonging to her, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-5.

All in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:5-2, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TWO

(Robbery - Second Degree)

NICHOLAS MARTINEZ

on or about February 28, 2002, at the City of Newark, in the County of Essex, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, in the course of committing a theft from Maria Correia, did purposely use force upon Maria Correia or purposely put her in fear of immediate bodily injury, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:15-1a and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT THREE

(Theft by Extortion - Second Degree)

NICHOLAS MARTINEZ

between on or about February 27, 2002, and on or about February 28, 2002, at the City of Newark, in the County of Essex, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did purposely and unlawfully obtain the property of another by extortion, that is, by purposely threatening bodily injury to Maria Correia, or by threatening to physically confine her, until she turned over property belonging to her, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-5 and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.
