This finding seemed rather obvious and average, however after months of research and trials, the most extensive conclusion came down to a natural solution of using tree buffers to prevent run off. By planting trees in precise locations around fields, surrounding specific crops, yields are increased while practically stopping run off. These conclusions were drawn from research professors at Missouri University through the Conservation Reserve Program.
