### II. Minutes from May State Meeting

**Motion by Kelsey Stockton** to dispense with the reading of the meeting minutes and approve them as distributed.

### III. Treasurer's Report

Motion by Sarah Kelly to accept the treasurer's report pending audit.

### IV. Guest Introductions and Attendance
