Please explain the supporting evidence for your main points.

When you read the committee research findings for this committee, it is pretty obvious to see that switching to American suppliers would greatly increase the cost of FFA unlimited items. As quoted in the National FFA Committee Research Findings, "National FFA carries over 3,000 items... Cost increases would depend on the item category and if it was available in the United States. To obtain the same quality here as overseas, it would cost 25% more, at a minimum, and it could cost as much as 60%—100% more." As you can see, this is a dramatic increase in price and many FFA members would not be able to afford it. Some of the FFA items for sale are not even made in the U.S. anymore because of increasing labor costs so they are only made over seas, and if we cut off business with other countries, not only would our prices go up but some items may not even be offered anymore. Global engagement is a driving point for National FFA and if we switched to American only suppliers we would be limiting our choices and affordability for our members.

The regional lines divide the states into the Western Region, Southern Region, Central Region, and Eastern Region. The regional lines divide membership evenly throughout the country. National Officer elections presently consist of electing an officer from each region. Therefore, allowing equal representation of each region at the National level. Holding at-large elections would require having National FFA bring the change to Congress in which it would then be voted on to open up and change the federal charter. Opening the federal charter would officially allow other changes to be made that could drastically affect the organization. Regional representation allows regions to be equally represented, and their diverse agricultural pursuits. Therefore, election of national officers should remain as it stands, with vice-presidents representing the diversity in each of the four regions.

The purpose of a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) is to reinforce the skills and materials that students have learned in the classroom. SAEs provide students the opportunities to apply those skills in an agricultural profession supervised by an industry professional. All of the jobs listed under "questionable SAEs" do not reinforce the skills taught in an Agricultural Education program. Baby sitting, building cars, working in restaurants, and working in retail stores does not increase one's agricultural skills or knowledge. Therefore, standards should be set to make sure SAEs maintain their purpose. If National FFA sets the standards for SAE, it would eliminate questionable SAEs allowed at the state level.

With the ever expanding opportunities in agriculture, we must expand our opportunities to members. Research and service learning based SAEs in agriculture are becoming more common than they had been in the past; therefore, implementing a skills attained column will give those students equal opportunity to obtain degrees in the FFA. The purpose of the skills obtained column would provide another measure of SAE achievement other than the traditional money earned/invested and documented hours. FFA is about creating opportunities for members and an additional column would allow more members the opportunity to grow in agricultural education pursuits. This will also allow students to be rewarded for their advancement and knowledge gained in the agriculture industry. The skills obtain column can cater to the non-traditional student in the non-traditional SAE and provide the same opportunities as the "traditional" FFA member.
