State Staff in attendance was Mrs. Noble, Mrs. Trivette and Ms. Butch. Guests in attendance were Annie Linke, Amanda Weber, and Cory Blake from Middlesex-East Brunswick.

II. Minutes from the June State Meeting

Motion by Delaney Gray to accept minutes as corrected.

III. Treasurer's Report

The status of chapter debts was discussed.

V. Committee Assignments.

A. Constitution, Bylaws, and Program of Activities

Joe Goodenough, Ernie Arians, Stephanie Tarlowe, and Alec McAlarnen were present. Mrs. Mclean was not present. The committee discussed possible edits to the POA and updating the constitution and bylaws to reflect the new affiliation wording.

B. Membership and Chapter Relations

They also recommend awarding the Outstanding Leadership award to both a male and female. The committee thinks that an award should also be given to a chapter officer in COLT and a FFA member attending LOC. There is a new recommendation for state officers to facilitate the 212 Conference. The final committee recommendation was to alter the location, time, and capacity for the career fair at ALLD. The next meeting will be held during the week of July 8th via Skype or phone conference.

D. State Applications.

The committee discussed the report from state convention which recommends keeping advisor of the year and courtesy corps applications, adding a short essay to the Star State Greenhand application, have weighted points to determine the superior chapter, and asking WLC candidates who were elected to state office to forfeit their WLC slot so another member could attend Washington Leadership Conference.

Motion by Gaspar Hernandez to accept the committee report as read.

E. Career Development Evaluation and Review

Kyle Clement, Gaspar Hernandez, and Jimmie Ferguson were present. Sam Rubenstein, Mrs. Morey and Joe Goodenough were absent. The committee discussed the report from state convention which recommends having separate sheets for each category on the ID in Turf Management and Nursery and Landscape, allowing more time for identification in Floriculture, asking the judges to specify swishing and spitting out rather than drink the milk in Milk Quality and Products, and providing clearer instructions at the judging tables in Fruit and Vegetable Identification. The committee also recommended having unopposed online CDE teams pass with at least a 75% score to compete at National Convention. Finally, the committee would like to send out a CDE interest inventory form to all of the chapters.

There is an implied second. Motion passes.

F. Horticultural Exposition Evaluation and Review

Delaney Gray, Ernie Arians, and Alec McAlarnen were present. Mrs. Hamilton was absent. The committee discussed the report from state convention which encourages the association to continue holding Horticultural Exposition at Mercer County College. They also recommend that "Dried Delights" needs to be re-designed, judges should be given measuring tapes, that there should be two standard size limits for the majority of the classes, and put emphasis on the classes with specific size limitations. The next committee meeting will be held on November 11th or 12th via skype or phone call.

G. State Convention Evaluation

A. State President's Conference

Anne Poinsett, Ernie Arians, and Mrs. Noble attended State President's Conference in Washington DC on July 23 – 28. The state officers were given a challenge by the National Officers which consist of five parts; Government outreach, YouTube video challenge about our FFA stories, media interviews, student workshops, and social media in order to promote advocacy. There were also 32 proposals for national delegate issues. The national officers created six committees which include the creation of a discussion meet, proficiency award areas that involve urban agriculture and food science, an ag summit, an agricultural education CDE, and an aquaculture CDE.

a. Dairy Handlers

The Dairy Handler's CDE was held July 24th at the Delaware State Fair in Harrington, Delaware. Leah Makrevich placed first and will have the opportunity to attend Big E and National Convention to represent New Jersey. Congratulations to all the participants!

Horse Evaluation took place July 25th at the Delaware State Fair in Harrington, Delaware. Cumberland Regional FFA Chapter placed first. Team members include Megan Davis, Michaela Hitchner, Melanie Mayhew, and Tania Mokienko. Heather Smylie of the Northern Burlington FFA Chapter placed first individually. The Cumberland Regional FFA chapter has the opportunity to represent New Jersey at the Big E in September and National Convention in October. Congratulations to all of the participants!

C. 360. Training

360° Training was held at the Eco-Complex in Bordentown on August 2- 4. Zach Wakeman, a former state officer from Virginia, facilitated the training. The state officers will be using the 360° curriculum for the COLT conference at Leadership Experience and Development. LEAD will be held the first weekend of October at the Crowne Plaza Monroe/South Brunswick Hotel.

D. National Leadership Conference for State Officers

National Leadership Conference for State Officers was held at the Crowne Plaza Monroe/South Brunswick Hotel on July 29-August 2. State FFA Officers from Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Delaware, Puerto Rico, and of course New Jersey attended. The State Officers learned about how they could effectively serve as a team from attending workshops about creating a vision, building a team, commitment, planning, and workshop development. All the State officers also enjoyed a picnic at Rutgers Gardens and a dinner cruise in the New York Harbor. After NLCSO ended, the New Jersey State Officers went to a gleaning at Von Thune Farms to support New Jersey Farmer's Against Hunger. The state officers harvested over 2,000 pounds of food which will go to food banks across the state.

1. Creation of a Discussion Meet

 Explore expanding current, or creating new, proficiency award areas inclusive of students engaged in urban agriculture or food service.

4. Agricultural Equipment Operation and Safety

 Explore the creation of a career development event which addresses agricultural equipment operation and safety.

5. Agricultural Education Career Development Event

 Explore the creation of a national agricultural education career development event based on the skills, competencies, and knowledge required for a career as an agricultural educator.

6. Aquaculture Career Development Event

 Explore the creation of an event that prepares students for a career in the aquaculture industry.

c. State Booth
