RESOLUTION # 14

FARMING ON PUBLIC LANDS

1	WHEREAS, throughout New Jersey, there exists publicly owned land that is actively
2	farmed under lease agreements between farmers and governmental entities of the state,
3	county or local level; and
4	WHEREAS, these lands remain a critical component of the available agricultural land
5	base in the state; and
6	WHEREAS, farmers have expressed some concerns about the terms of these lease
7	agreements; and
8	WHEREAS, these concerns include questions about certain restrictions or
9	encumbrances imposed upon farmers that, in some instances, hinder agricultural production,
10	including the ability to deal with encroaching wildlife that destroy crops; and
11	WHEREAS, there has traditionally been no uniform, statewide model for renting
12	these lands for agricultural purposes, increasing the risk of inconsistencies and individualized
13	use restrictions in lease agreements that can impede or limit generally accepted farming
14	practices; and
15	WHEREAS, in some instances, farmers make substantial investments in rented
16	ground as a means of enhancing an individual parcel's agricultural productivity for the long-
17	term, and thus are negatively impacted by exceedingly short-term lease arrangements; and
18	WHEREAS, an example of such an impact would be a farmer using leased public
19	lands to grow and harvest trees, including Christmas trees, which can take seven to 10 years
20	to mature and become marketable; and
21	WHEREAS, recent discussions between farmer groups and senior staff at the New
22	Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) have resulted in constructive
23	movement toward more consistent and uniform lease language; and

WHEREAS, representatives from the Department of Agriculture and NJDEP have
 had discussions about extending the length of leases, and the Department will continue to
 engage NJDEP in discussion of topics surrounding farming on leased public lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the delegates to the 106th State
 Agricultural Convention, assembled through a virtual platform hosted in Trenton, New
 Jersey, in accordance with COVID-19 pandemic recommendations, on February 17, 2021,
 do hereby urge the State Board of Agriculture and Department of Agriculture, along with the
 New Jersey Farm Bureau, to continue reviewing the current status of lease arrangements for
 agricultural purposes throughout the state.

33 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that we urge any lease of public lands in which a 34 county or municipality auctions the leasing rights include provisions for an open public 35 auction process, and in the absence of an open public auction, the current farmer be given 36 the opportunity to match the highest bid.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we urge all municipalities, counties, or others
 leasing public lands to farmers give special consideration to those farmers who plant crops
 that take seven to 10 years to mature to marketability – e.g. Christmas trees or other trees –
 when the maturing of those crops would take longer than the term of the initial lease.

41 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that we urge the State Board, the Department and 42 New Jersey Farm Bureau to continue soliciting the input of county boards of agriculture and 43 commodity organizations, and that the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) be 44 consulted on lands leased for farming as part of this review process.

45 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that we acknowledge the recent movement within the 46 NJDEP toward more consistent and uniform language on leases to farm public lands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we urge the SADC and Legislature to recognize
and add language, where appropriate, defining a "commercial farm" to include leased public
lands, which otherwise satisfy the eligibility for Farmland Assessment.

- 50 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that we strongly urge that farmers leasing public
- 51 lands have the right to protect their crops from any and all pests that devalue or threaten
- 52 those crops, using any method deemed to be an appropriate BMP.
