RESOLUTION # 20

FARMER MEMBERS ON THE STATE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

1	WHEREAS, the State Agriculture Development Committee (SADC) oversees the
2	Farmland Preservation and Right to Farm programs in New Jersey under the Agriculture
3	Retention and Development Act (ARDA); and
4	WHEREAS, the SADC includes among its members, by law, four people "actively
5	engaged in farming" in New Jersey as farmers, who provide invaluable knowledge and
6	expertise on farming to the SADC's deliberations on various issues; and
7	WHEREAS, the importance of the contributions of the SADC's farmer members to
8	discussions of the Committee regarding agricultural issues has been recognized previously
9	by the addition of "alternate" farmer members to take the place of farmer members who
10	cannot attend a particular meeting, so that the input of farming expertise to the conversation
11	is not lost; and
12	WHEREAS, the SADC's Supplemental Code of Ethics was recently interpreted to
13	call for farmer members to recuse themselves from discussions at the SADC level if they
14	also have been involved in discussions and/or votes on the same topic as a member of the
15	CADB at the county level; and
16	WHEREAS, that provision in the Code of Ethics recently resulted in all four farmer
17	members of the SADC having to recuse themselves from discussion and voting on the issue
18	of recommendations to the Legislature regarding Special Occasion Events on preserved
19	farms because they had been involved in discussions at the CADB level regarding those
20	recommendations; and
21	WHEREAS, the resulting lack of any farmer voice in those discussions at the SADC
22	level, on this or any other issue, could lead to the agricultural industry's viewpoint on the
23	matter being greatly diluted.
24	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the delegates to the 106 th State
25	Agricultural Convention, assembled through a virtual platform hosted in Trenton, New

Jersey, in accordance with COVID-19 pandemic recommendations, on February 17, 2021, do hereby strongly urge the State Agriculture Development Committee to amend its Code of Ethics to make it clear that the SADC's farmer members should recuse themselves from discussing and/or voting upon specific matters at the SADC level in cases where the member has a direct personal interest, or if they have voted upon matters as a member of their County Agriculture Development Board, but not if those issues are general issues such as policy, legislative or regulatory matters.
