Manure Hauling Considerations

The highly contagious and deadly avian influenza (HPAI) is an immediate, high-level threat to poultry in New Jersey. To help safeguard the industry, strict standards for cleaning vehicles, containers and materials that transport poultry and related products have been enacted by the NJ Department of Agriculture.

Cleaning and disinfecting are essential to avoid spread of avian flu

2025 General Quarantine Order(s): Virus Control for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI); Restriction of poultry litter imported from HPAI affected states.

- Poultry litter imported from HPAI affected states requires an approved permit issued by NJ State Veterinarian.

- All vehicles, conveyances, containers, and materials that transport poultry and related products must be completely cleaned and disinfected using commercial truck washing equipment before entry onto a new areas.

**Biosecurity isn't optional.
Do your part.**

Don't allow non-essential vehicles access to your farm.

To avoid spreading disease from farm to farm, be sure any trucks and trailers that enter your farm have been cleaned and disinfected.

Thoroughly clean and disinfect footwear, clothing, cages, crates, coops, equipment used to handle poultry manure, poultry waste, poultry feed, litter, or bedding.
