Re: 2023-2024 Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

Please pass this along to Food Service Directors and any other appropriate school staff, such as wellness committee coordinators, school nurses, or teachers.

The USDA Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program (FFVP) will continue for the 2023-2024 school year. The New Jersey Department of Agriculture is now accepting applications from New Jersey **elementary schools with 50% or more students eligible for free or reduced-price meals** to participate in this program for the 2023-2024 school year. (*Free and reduced-price eligibility information will be taken from your school's October 2022 school lunch reimbursement voucher.*)

- NEW this year the application <u>must be submitted and certified in SNEARS</u>, the webbased reporting system used for the school lunch program, <u>by Friday, May 26, 2023</u> if you are interested in being considered for this program. Applications that are submitted and certified after May 26, 2023 will be disqualified.

The FFVP provides funding for schools to serve free fresh fruits and vegetables to students during the school day, outside of regular mealtimes. **The goals of the FFVP are to:**

- Create healthier school environments by providing healthier food choices.
- Expand the variety of fruits and vegetables children experience.
- Increase children's fruit and vegetable consumption.
- Make a difference in children's diets to impact their present and future health.

This school year 211 schools are participating in the FFVP. The funding for 2023-2024 will range from \$50 - \$75 per student for the school year.

All schools currently participating in the FFVP will automatically be enrolled in the Program for 2023-2024. **These schools will need to submit and certify a new FFVP application form.**

Applications should be submitted by individual schools as they are listed on their Child Nutrition Program's Application Packet. It is IMPORTANT that you check with your Food Service Director to find out how your school is listed on the Child Nutrition Application. This is essential if your school is an Annex. Each school listed on the Child Nutrition Application must complete and submit a separate application based on their specific needs. Schools will be selected based on the following criteria:

A- SELECTION CRITERIA

To be selected for the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program, a school must:

- Have 50 percent or more of its students eligible for free or reduced-price meals. (USDA requires that priority must be given to schools with the <u>greatest</u> percentages of lowincome students. Free and reduced-price eligibility information will be taken from your school's October 2022 school lunch reimbursement voucher.)
- Be an elementary school.
 - Early Childhood Schools are eligible if they participate in the National School Lunch Program.
 - K-8 Schools are eligible.
 - Middle Schools and High Schools are <u>not</u> eligible.
- Operate the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) in good standing.
- Be in compliance with all NJDA grants and program regulations and procedures.
- Submit and certify a complete application packet, specific for each school in SNEARS. (Applications should be submitted by individual schools as they are listed on their Child Nutrition Program's Application. The information provided should be tailored to the specific school applying for the program. <u>Duplicate responses that are submitted for several</u> <u>schools will result in the elimination of each of these schools' applications.</u>)
- Schools meeting the above criteria will be selected by a committee from the NJ Department of Agriculture based on:
 - Their percentage of free/reduced price eligible students based on October's 2022 school lunch voucher.
 - Their questionnaire responses indicating their ability to successfully implement the program and fully utilize the funding. <u>All questions must be answered in</u> <u>SNEARS.</u> <u>All information requested must be complete and accurate.</u> <u>Missing</u> <u>information or unanswered questions will result in the elimination of the</u> <u>application.</u>

B- EXPECTATIONS OF PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS

- Selected schools must provide **fresh** fruits and vegetables **free to all students at times other than at meal service periods.** (Fruits and vegetables are not permitted to go home with students or be served for Afterschool Snack Programs.)
- Participating schools must submit information monthly about participation, purchases, and costs, to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture through SNEARS, the web-based reporting system used for the school lunch program. All cost documentation must be kept on file for review.

- Schools interested in applying for the FFVP are strongly encouraged to read USDA's Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program Handbook for Schools, which is available online at: <u>https://www.fns.usda.gov/ffvp/fresh-fruits-and-vegetable-program-handbook-schools</u>
- <u>All newly selected schools MUST participate in an orientation, or your school will be</u> <u>eliminated.</u> (Specific dates & locations to be announced.)

C- USE OF FUNDS

• Funds are to be used primarily to purchase <u>fresh</u> fruits and vegetables to be made available at no charge to students. A small percentage of funds may be used for operating and administrative costs, such as labor for preparation and distribution of fruits and vegetables, equipment, and administrative costs to manage the program.

D- HOW TO APPLY

- Submit and Certify the 2023-2024 FFVP Application Packet in SNEARS <u>by Friday, May</u> 26, 2023 for consideration to participate in the 2023-2024 FFVP. <u>Applications submitted</u> and certified after May 26, 2023 will be disqualified.

E- PROGRAM TIMELINE

- August & September 2023 Mandatory orientation for schools new to FFVP (Specific dates to be announced)
- September 2023 FFVP Voucher Webinar (Specific date to be announced)

NEW FFVP Application Instructions



*Only the **Submitter** and **Alternate Submitter** listed on your Child Nutrition Program's Application Packet **can complete the FFVP Application in SNEARS**, the web-based reporting system used for the school lunch program.

Scroll down on your left and click on "Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program". The new FFVP application can be found and downloaded at this location. You can enter the application information but you <u>must send it to your</u> <u>Food Service Director or Board of Education office</u> so they can enter your application onto SNEARS, the webbased reporting system used for the school lunch program.

SNEARS FFVP Application

- 1. Initial step is to go to <u>www.nj.gov</u>., just as you would to complete FFVP vouchers.
 - > Press the Login button on the top left of screen.
 - > Enter the Login ID and Password.
 - > Select the Food and Nutrition Electronic Services link.
- 2. Click on the FFVP, Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program, link to access Application.
- 3. On the next screen, click on **FFVP Application**.
- 4. Select your School Food Authority, SFA. Next, hit Continue.
- 5. On the next screen, click on **Site Application**. This will take you to the next screen where all your schools will be listed.
- 6. Click on the school that you want to submit a FFVP application for. Complete FFVP application questions.
- 7. At the end of the application, you will have 2 selections:
 - Complete Later (All data entered will be saved. The status of the application will indicate "Incomplete".)
 - Save for Submission (If you click on this, you can still go back into the application to make changes.)
- 8. After you have completed and saved all your FFVP applications, click on the box at the bottom, **Back to Application Summary**.
- 9. The next step is to click on the **Agreement and Certification.** At the bottom of this screen **click on the box agreeing to the terms listed above.** Next, click on **Save** at the bottom of the screen.
- 10. After you have completed your Agreement and Certification, click on **Submit for Certification**.
- 11. A **message** will be **sent to** the **Certifier** to Certify the FFVP applications.

Certifying FFVP Application

- 1. Only the **Certifier** and **Alternate Certifier** listed on your Child Nutrition Program's Application Packet can certify the FFVP applications.
- 2. After selecting your SFA, hit Continue.
- 3. On the next screen you must click on the box next to "We the Principal...".
- 4. Next, click on **Certify for State Approval**. Be sure on the next screen that it indicates that the Site Application and Agreement and Certification have been Certified.
