**The County agrees to comply with the terms and conditions as listed below:**

A total of up to \$15,000 per county, subject to the availability of funds, is accessible to county governments or their agencies in the counties that have been under Spotted lanternfly quarantine, who are interested in performing chemical treatment activities against this invasive foreign insect during the 2022 season.

**Organizations that May Apply for Funding from NJDA:** New Jersey County governments or agencies in all New Jersey counties with priority being given to the quarantine counties of Warren, Mercer, Hunterdon, Morris, Somerset, Morris, Monmouth, Burlington, Gloucester, Camden, Salem, Essex, and Union, may apply for funding to provide chemical treatments and activities against populations of this insect on their private and public lands. This opportunity may be opened up to other county agencies if funding is available.

It is the intent that the NJDA will pay by reimbursement for all actual costs provided by the county in providing the treatment services, which shall include the costs for equipment, materials, and labor, as expended and submitted by the county.

**Additional requirements** to participants under the grant program:

- Counties shall purchase the approved treatment materials by appropriate fiscal procurement procedures.
- Counties shall submit invoices for the obtained pesticides.
- Counties shall send their designated application personnel to training provided by the NJDA.
- Counties shall provide pesticide public application notifications compliant with NJDEP pesticide regulations appropriate with the areas scheduled for treatments.
- Counties shall provide to the NJDA, on a weekly basis, the Block and Lot information, as well as number and types of trees, where treatments have been conducted.
- If a county is procuring the services of an independent contractor for treatment services, the county will provide the NJDA with details of the independent contractor.
