Dear Grower Representative,

The New Jersey Department of Agriculture is pleased to tentatively announce that approximately \$300,000.00 of Specialty Crop Block Grant (SCBG) funds are expected to be available this year from the United States Department of Agriculture to directly support New Jersey's specialty crop industry organizations beginning in late 2018 or January 2019.

Although the official budget allocation has not been made by the USDA they are encouraging State Departments of Agriculture to begin soliciting project proposals. In the interim, all Specialty Crop Block Grant Program applications are to be considered tentative pending the publication of the federal approval of the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) in the federal registry for the USDA's Specialty Crop Block Grant program. The New Jersey Department of Agriculture is requesting that interested organizations representing New Jersey's specialty crop industry submit these tentative project proposals for consideration for this funding.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Individual producers or solitary businesses are not eligible to apply. Applicants must be a legal entity representing multiple growers and have the legal capacity to enter into a contract. Applicants are strongly encouraged to provide a cash match for their projects.

For this grant program "specialty crops" are defined as; vegetables, fruits including grapes for wine, nuts, horticultural products including Christmas trees, honey, herbs, potatoes, sweet corn and other specialty crops. Agricultural commodities which are NOT eligible for these grant funds include, but are not limited to: feed crops, food grains, livestock, dairy and poultry products including eggs, range grasses and oilseed crops.

The deadline for 2019 SCBG project applications to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture is March 29, 2019.

To be eligible for a grant, projects must "enhance the competitiveness" of specialty crops and might include, but are not limited to: research, promotion, marketing, nutrition, trade enhancement, food safety, food security, plant health programs, education, "buy local" programs, increased consumption, increased innovation, improved efficiency and reduced costs of distribution systems, environmental concerns and conservation, product development, and developing cooperatives.

Examples of past SCBG projects have included advertising and promotion, integrated pest management, various forms of production research and education and outreach. All proposed projects will be required to follow a standardized format and comply with the enclosed USDA guidelines.
