
Dear Mr. Russo:

As you are aware, the Ocean County Agriculture Development Board (Board) received a complaint for a Right To Farm (RTF) review of the operations taking place on the property listed above. On July 1, 2011, you were sent a letter which informed you of the minimum eligibility requirements to receive RTF protection. The original deadline for production of the necessary documentation to prove eligibility for Right to Farm protection was July 11, 2011. On July 12, 2011, you contacted Mr. Allen and informed him that you never received the correspondence dated July 1, 2011. As such, Mr. Allen resent the letter on July 12, 2011 and provided you a courtesy extension of time until July 31, 2011 for the Board to receive the necessary documentation. Since the Board did not receive all necessary documentation to verify eligibility for Right to Farm protection by July 31, 2011, the property located at the above address is not eligible for Right to Farm protection and will not receive further consideration by the Board.

You should be aware that the Right to Farm Act protects qualified commercial farm operations against nuisance complaints and unreasonable municipal regulation. N.J.S.A. 4:1C-9 and 10. Accordingly, the Right to Farm Act does not protect farms that are in violation of State or Federal laws and regulations. N.J.S.A. 4:1C-9. As such, the property is subject to any and all outstanding Municipal, State and Federal violations.
