NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC NOTICE

IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION OF SOUTH JERSEY GAS COMPANY FOR APPROVAL OF BASE RATE ADJUSTMENTS PURSUANT TO THE ACCELERATED INFRASTRUCTURE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM ("AIRP II")

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on June 30, 2021, South Jersey Gas Company ("South Jersey" or "Company") filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board" or "BPU") in BPU Docket No. GR21060951 seeking approval to increase base rates associated with the Company's Accelerated Infrastructure Replacement Program ("AIRP II") ("Petition").

The Board approved AIRP II and the associated cost recovery mechanism on October 31, 2016 in Docket No. GO16020175 ("Order"). The purpose of AIRP II is to continue to eliminate aging and leak prone materials and enhance the reliability and safety of the Company's gas distribution system. The Order authorized the Company to invest approximately \$302.5 million over a five (5)-year period, commencing October 1, 2016, and ending September 30, 2021, to replace cast iron and unprotected bare steel mains and associated services. ("AIRP II Investments").

The Order also authorized South Jersey to make annual filings with the Board to recover the costs associated with AIRP II Investments, and to earn a return of those investments through annual adjustments to base rates. This Petition seeks Board approval to recover the revenue requirements associated with AIRP II Investments placed inservice from July 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021 of approximately \$69 million with a January 1, 2022 rate effective date.

If the proposed increase is approved, this rate would increase the annual bill of a residential heating customer using 100 therms by \$1.89 or 1.2%.

Based upon projections, and assuming approval of AIRP II as proposed by the Company, the subsequent incremental rate and the impact on a residential and general service customer using less than 5,000 therms annually are estimated as follows:

The following Rate Schedules will also be affected by the Company's proposed base rate increase: General Service – Large Volume ("GSG-LV"), Comprehensive Firm Transportation Service ("CTS"), Large Volume Service ("LVS"), Electric Generation Service ("EGS"), Electric Generation Service – Large Volume ("EGS-LV"), Natural Gas Vehicle Service ("NGV"), Yard Lights Service ("YLS") and Street Lights Service ("SLS").

The Board has the statutory authority to establish South Jersey's rates at levels it finds just and reasonable as well as to establish the effective date of such rates. Therefore, the BPU may establish the rates at levels and/or an effective date other than those proposed by South Jersey.

Any assistance required by customers in ascertaining the impact of the proposed rate increase will be provided by the Company upon request.

A copy of the Notice of Filing and Public Hearings on the Petition is being served upon the clerk, executive, or administrator of each municipality and county within the Company's service territory. The Petition and this Notice have also been sent to the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), who will represent the interests of all South Jersey customers in this proceeding.
