- A. Docket No. EO26010015 – In the Matter of the Alleged Non-Compliance of Energy Services Providers, LLC d/b/a New Jersey Gas & Electric to Comply with Certain Provisions of N.J.S.A. 48:3-78 et seq., and the New Jersey Administrative Code, N.J.A.C. 14:4-1.1 et seq.; and

Docket No. EE25100581L – Energy Services Providers, LLC d/b/a New Jersey Gas & Electric; NJG&E – Application for Initial Electric Power Supplier License.

These matters involve potential violations under the Electric Discount and Energy Competition Act, N.J.S.A. 48:3-48 et seq., by Energy Services Providers, LLC d/b/a New Jersey Gas & Electric; NJG&E (“NJG&E”) whereby NJG&E allegedly failed to submit a timely annual information update form for an electric power supplier license. NJG&E and Board Staff executed a stipulation of settlement to resolve all issues concerning the violations alleged by Board Staff and NJG&E has filed an initial application to reapply for a new license.

- A. Docket No. WR25080471 – In the Matter of the Petition of Gordon’s Corner Water Company for Approval to Change the Levels of its Purchased Water Adjustment Clause Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq.

The Board will consider Gordons Corner Water Company’s August 2025 petition seeking to modify its Purchased Water Adjustment Clause. The parties executed a stipulation which, if approved by the Board, would increase the monthly bill of the average residential customer by approximately \$1.89.
