BY THE BOARD:

On February 28, 2008, Theodore Ubanwa (Petitioner) filed a petition with the Board of Public Utilities (Board) disputing certain bills of New Jersey American Water Company (Respondent) for water services.

After the filing of Respondent's answer, the Board transmitted this matter to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for hearing and initial disposition as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 et seq. This matter was assigned to Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Gail M. Cookson.

While this matter was pending at the OAL, the parties engaged in negotiations and entered into and executed a Settlement Agreement dated July 11, 2008 that was submitted to the ALJ. By Initial Decision issued on August 20, 2008, and submitted to the Board on August 26, 2008, ALJ Cookson found that the agreement was voluntary, that its terms fully disposed of all issues in controversy and that it met the requirements of N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1. Pursuant to the terms of their settlement, the parties agreed that, of the \$1,421.65 in dispute, the Petitioner's payment of \$100.00 would constitute a full and final settlement of this matter. In return, Petitioner agreed that the petition in this matter should be dismissed with prejudice.

After a review and consideration of the Initial Decision and the agreement of the parties, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that, by the terms of the agreement, the parties have resolved all outstanding contested issues in this matter. Accordingly, the Board HEREBY ADOPTS the Initial Decision and agreement of the parties in their entirety as if fully set out herein.

On May 15, 2008, this matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for hearing as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to-15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 to- 13. The matter was scheduled for an in-person prehearing conference on July 22, 2008. On that date the parties reached an agreement. The parties subsequently submitted a fully executed settlement document which is attached hereto and made part hereof. I have reviewed the record and terms of the Settlement and FIND:

- The parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by the signatures of the parties or their representatives.
- The settlement fully disposes of all issues in controversy and is consistent with law.

Settlement Agreement

This Settlement Agreement is made by and between NEW JERSEY-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY, INC. ("NJAWC"), a corporation doing business at 131 Woodcrest Road, Cherry Hill, New Jersey 08034 and Theodore Ubanwa, a NJAWC customer with service being provided at 14 Evelyn Court, Maplewood, New Jersey 07040, and having NJAWC Account Number 18-1430443-0 ("Customer") (NJAWC and Customer are collectively hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Parties"). Inconsideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and terms contained herein, the Parties to this Settiement Agreement agree to be legally bound hereby as follows:

- 1. The Parties agree that of the \$1,421.65 in dispute, Customer's payment of \$100.00 on July 21, 2008 constitutes a full and final settlement of this matter.
- 2. Customer agrees to dismiss his complaint filed against NJAWC under BPU Docket No. WC08020121U/OAL Docket No. PUCCC 05834-2008N with prejudice and will provide written notification to NJAWC and the Honorable Gail Cookson, ALJ, that he has done so.
- 3. This Settlement Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey. In the event that any provision of this Settlement Agreement is deemed unenforceable, those portions not deemed unenforceable shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4. Any modification of this Settlement Agreement, or additional obligation(s) assumed by either party in connection with this Settlement Agreement, shall be binding only if evidenced in writing and signed by each party.
