BY THE BOARD1:

On January 10, 2012, Middlesex Water Company ("Company" or "Petitioner"), a public utility of the State of New Jersey filed with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.11, 14:1-5.12 and 14:9-7.1 et seq., a petition ("Petition") to increase rates for water service, to make other tariff changes, and to update the base consumption and base costs which were established in the Company's prior base rate proceeding and utilized when setting the Company's Purchased Water Adjustment Clause ("PWAC") in BPU Docket No. WR11010038. The Company also requested authority to establish a Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC"). The Company requested a rate increase of approximately \$11.3 million or approximately 17.47% above the adjusted annual level of present rate revenues for the test year ending June 30, 2012.

Motions to Intervene filed by the following parties, were unopposed and granted intervention status – Marlboro Township ("Marlboro"), the Old Bridge Municipal Utilities Authority ("Old Bridge") and the Township of East Brunswick ("East Brunswick").

By this Order, the Board considers the Initial Decision recommending adoption of the Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") executed by the Company, Board Staff, the Division of Rate Counsel, Old Bridge, and East Brunswick (collectively the "Signatory Parties"), agreeing to an overall increase in revenues totaling \$8,100,000 representing a 12.70% increase over Company revenues totaling \$63,765,176. The Parties propose that these rates will be effective on July 18, 2012. Marlboro, while not a Signatory Party, submitted a letter indicating that it does not oppose the settlement.

BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

For purposes of this petition, the Company serves approximately 59,000 water and wastewater customers in the Townships of Edison and Woodbridge, the Boroughs of South Plainfield, Metuchen and Carteret and the City of South Amboy in Middlesex County and the Township of Clark in Union County. On a contract basis, the Company serves part of the Township of Edison, the Boroughs of Highland Park and Sayreville, the Old Bridge Municipal Utilities Authority, the Marlboro Township Municipal Utilities Authority and the City of Rahway. The Company also services under a special contract basis for water treatment and pumping services the Township of East Brunswick.

As filed, the Company requested the increase in rates to become effective on February 21, 2012. By Order dated February 10, 2012, with an effective date of February 21, 2012, the Board suspended the Company's proposed rate increase until June 21, 2012. The Petitioner did not seek interim rate relief pending final determination on the petition.³

This matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") on February 9, 2012, and Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Leland S. McGee was assigned to hear the case. A Pre-Hearing Conference (via telephone) was convened by ALJ McGee on April 16, 2012.

After proper notice, a public hearing in the service territory was held in Woodbridge, New Jersey on the evening of May 16, 2012, at the Woodbridge Community Center. Two members of the public provided comments that mainly focused on the adverse economic impact and financial hardships for the average Middlesex Water Company ratepayer.

Subsequent to the public hearing, the Parties to the proceeding engaged in numerous settlement negotiations and as a result of these discussions and extensive discovery, the Signatory Parties reached a settlement on all issues. The parties subsequently executed a Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation").

On July 9, 2012, ALJ McGee issued his Initial Decision in this matter recommending adoption of the Stipulation executed by the Parties, finding that the Parties had voluntarily agreed to the Stipulation and that the Stipulation fully disposes of all issues and is consistent with the law.

DISCUSSIONS AND FINDINGS

Among the provisions of the Stipulation⁴, the Signatory Parties recommend that the Company's base rates be increased by \$8,100,000, representing a 12.70% increase over Company revenues totaling \$63,765,176. The Signatory Parties further recommend a rate base of \$202,444,635 with a test year ending June 30, 2012, adjusted for known and measurable changes and that the Company be authorized a return on equity of 10.15%, a preferred stock cost rate of 5.07% and a cost of debt rate of 4.67%, for an overall rate of return of 7.34%. The overall rate of return is calculated by using the Company's current capital structure consisting of 51.00% long term debt, 0.29% preferred stock and 48.71% common equity ratios.

The Signatory Parties further recommend the following:

- All expenses associated with One Call mark-outs arising from the modifications to N.J.A.C. 14:2-1.1 et seq. effective October 15, 2007, shall be deferred by the Company. The Company will recover those expenses with interest at the rate shown in the Federal Reserve statistical release closest to January 1 of each year for seven (7) year constant maturity treasuries plus sixty (60) basis points. The interest rate shall remain in effect for a one-year period. At such time as the Company seeks recovery of these expenses, any party may challenge the prudence of the level of such costs;
- The Company will file a Cost of Service Study in its next base proceeding. Upon the filing of that Cost of Service Study, the Petitioner agrees to accommodate reasonable requests to perform additional analyses utilizing the Company's Cost of Service Study model;
- The Signatory Parties agree that the Board should update the findings required by <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:9-7.1 <u>et seq.</u> related to the Company's PWAC. Those updated findings are contained in Exhibit C hereto (which was also provided as Exhibit H to the Petition); and
- Once the rates emanating from this proceeding have been made effective, the Petitioner
 has agreed not to seek an increase in its base rates for water service for two years from
 the effective date. Specifically excluded from this agreement are the Petitioner's PWAC
 rates, and DSIC rates, should the Board authorize the Petitioner to implement a DSIC at
 a future date.

The Signatory Parties agree that the tariffs, implementing the terms of this Stipulation should be approved in their entirety. The tariffs reflect an increase of approximately 15.27% for General Metered Service [Rate Schedule No. 1]. The tariffs also reflect the following changes:

(a) The Private Fire Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 2] has been increased approximately 0.80%⁵, and the Public Fire Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 3]

⁵ Please note that the Private Fire Service rate consists of a facilities charge and a consumption

component. The facilities charge has not been increased, and the consumption component has been increased by approximately 15.27% (consistent with the increase to all General Metered Service customers) to result in an overall increase to Private Fire Service customers of approximately 0.80%.

has been revised to reflect that hydrant charges have been increased 2.95% and inch foot charges have not been changed, resulting in an overall increase of 2.00%;

- (b) The Service Under Contract rate [Rate Schedule No. 5] has been increased 12.50%;
- (c) The Special Contract Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 6] has been increased by 12.50%;
- (d) The Transmission Service South River Basin rate [Rate Schedule No. 7] has been increased 12.50%; and
- (e) The Transmission Service Northeast Sector rate [Rate Schedule No. 8] has been increased approximately 173.87%.

The Board is mindful of the impact any rate increase has on its customers. However, having reviewed the record in this matter, including ALJ McGee's Initial Decision, the Stipulation, and the letter from Marlboro indicating that it does not oppose the Stipulation, the Board <u>FINDS</u> that the Signatory Parties have voluntarily agreed to the Stipulation, and that the Stipulation fully disposes of all issues in this proceeding and is consistent with the law. In reaching this decision, the Board must balance the needs of the ratepayer to receive safe, adequate and proper service at reasonable rates, while allowing the utility the opportunity to earn a fair rate of return. See <u>FPC v. Hope Natural Gas</u>, 320 <u>U.S. 591 (1944)</u>; <u>N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.S.A. 48:3-1. Therefore, the Board <u>FINDS</u> the Initial Decision, which adopts the Stipulation to be reasonable, in the public interest, and in accordance with the law. Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Initial Decision and the Stipulation, attached hereto, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if they were fully set forth at length herein, subject to the following:</u>

- a. The tariff sheets attached to the Stipulation containing rates and charges conforming to the Stipulation and designed to produce the additional revenues to which the Parties have stipulated herein are <u>HEREBY ACCEPTED</u>; and
- b. The stipulated increase and the tariff design allocations for each customer classification are <u>HEREBY ACCEPTED</u>.

Based upon the forgoing, the Board <u>HEREBY APPROVES</u> an overall increase in revenues in the amount of \$8,100,000 representing a 12.70% increase over Company revenues totaling \$71,865,181.

The Board <u>HEREBY ORDERS</u> the Company to submit complete revised tariffs conforming to the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and this Order within five (5) days from the date of this Order.

This Order shall be effective on July 20, 2012.



TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

This Stipulation of Settlement resolves all issues raised in BPU Docket No. WR12010027 in which Middlesex Water Company ("Middlesex" or the "Company") is seeking an increase in rates for water service, and other specified tariff changes. The Parties that have participated in these proceedings are as follows: Middlesex, the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff"). Also participating in this proceeding were the following entities who filed Motions to Intervene, which were not opposed

by the Company: Marlboro Township ("Marlboro"), the Old Bridge Municipal Utilities Authority ("Old Bridge"), and the Township of East Brunswick ("East Brunswick").

As a result of an analysis of the petition, pre-filed testimony and exhibits, several conferences, negotiations, responses to information requests, and a public hearing held in the service territory, the Signatory Parties to these proceedings have come to an agreement on the issues in dispute in this matter. The Signatory Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

The procedural history of this matter is as follows:

On January 10, 2012, Middlesex Water Company, a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.11, 14:1-5.12 and 14:9-7.1 et seq., filed a petition to increase rates for water service, to make other tariff changes, and to update the base consumption and base costs which were established in the Company's prior base rate proceeding and utilized when setting the Company's purchased water adjustment clause ("PWAC") in BPU Docket No. WR11010038. The Company also requested authority to establish a Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC"). The Company requested a rate increase of approximately \$11.3 million or approximately 17.47% above the adjusted annual level of present rate revenues for the test year ending June 30, 2012.

The Board transmitted the matter to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") and Administrative Law Judge Leland S. McGee was assigned to hear the case. On February 10, 2012, the Board entered an Order suspending the proposed rates until June 21, 2012. A Pre-Hearing Conference (via telephone) was convened by Judge McGee on April 16, 2012. After proper notice, a public hearing in the service territory was held in Woodbridge, New Jersey on the evening of May 16, 2012, at the Woodbridge Community Center, 600 Main Street, Woodbridge, New Jersey. Two members of the public appeared to provide comments.

The Company has provided a number of updates to its original filing, including updated information regarding numerous aspects of the Company's financial condition. As noted above, the Company in its Petition sought to establish a DSIC, but the Signatory Parties agree that the Company's DSIC request is deemed withdrawn.

Settlement Terms

Numerous settlement discussions were held among the Parties, and this process resulted in the following stipulations among the Signatory Parties:

- 1. For the purposes of this agreement, the Company's total rate base is agreed to be \$202,444,635. The test year is the 12 months ended June 30, 2012, adjusted for known and measurable changes.
- 2. For the purposes of this agreement, the return on equity is agreed to be set at 10.15%. The Signatory Parties have also agreed that this return on equity will calculate to an overall authorized rate of return of 7.34%, derived from an overall capital structure that does not include short-term debt.
- 3. The Signatory Parties agree that utilizing this overall rate of return of 7.34% would result in an overall additional revenue requirement of \$8,100,000. This amount can be calculated as follows:

4. The Signatory Parties stipulate that the revenue requirement for Middlesex should be set based upon a 10.15% return on equity (7.34% overall rate of return), resulting in an increase of \$8,100,000 over present rate revenues of \$63,765,176, or an overall revenue increase of

approximately 12.70%. The Signatory Parties agree that this figure represents the level of revenue that will help to ensure that the Company will continue to provide safe, adequate, and proper water service to its customers. See Exhibit A (proof of revenues).

- 5. The Signatory Parties agree that the attached tariffs (Exhibit B hereto), implementing the terms of this Stipulation, should be approved in their entirety, and recommend their approval by the Administrative Law Judge and the Board. The tariffs reflect an increase of approximately 15.27% for General Metered Service [Rate Schedule No. 1]. The tariffs also reflect the following changes:
 - (a) the Private Fire Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 2] has been increased approximately 0.80%¹, and the Public Fire Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 3] has been revised to reflect that hydrant charges have been increased 2.95% and inch foot charges have not been changed, resulting in an overall increase of 2.00%;
 - (b) the Service Under Contract rate [Rate Schedule No. 5] has been increased 12.50%;
 - (c) the Special Contract Service rate [Rate Schedule No. 6] has been increased by 12.50%;
 - (d) the Transmission Service South River Basin rate [Rate Schedule No. 7] has been increased 12.50%; and
 - (e) the Transmission Service Northeast Sector [Rate Schedule No. 8] has been increased approximately 173.87%.
- 6. While agreeing for the purposes of this Stipulation to the results of the allocations as evidenced in the tariffs and proof of revenues attached to this Stipulation of Settlement, the

¹ Please note that the Private Fire Service rate consists of a facilities charge and a consumption component. The facilities charge has not been increased, and the consumption component has been increased by approximately 15.27% (consistent with the increase to all General Metered Service customers) to result in an overall increase to Private Fire Service customers of approximately 0.80%.

Parties hereto have not agreed upon any specific allocation methodology or policy in the resolution of the rate design issues raised in this proceeding.

- 7. The Signatory Parties agree that the Company will file a Cost of Service Study in its next base rate proceeding. Upon the filing of that Cost of Service Study, the Company agrees to accommodate reasonable requests to perform additional analyses utilizing the Company's Cost of Service Study model.
- 8. The Signatory Parties agree that the Board should update the findings required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq. related to the Company's PWAC. Those updated findings are contained in Exhibit C hereto (which was also provided as Exhibit H to the Petition).
- 9. The Signatory Parties agree that once the rates emanating from this proceeding have been made effective, the Company may not increase its base rates for water service for two years from the effective date. Specifically excluded from this Stipulation provision are the Company's PWAC rates, and DSIC rates, should the Board authorize the Company to implement a DSIC.
- 10. The Signatory Parties agree that all expenses associated with One Call mark-outs arising from the modifications to N.J.A.C. 14:2-1.1 et seq. effective October 15, 2007 and incurred following the effective date of the Board's order in this current matter shall be deferred by the Company. The Company may recover those expenses with interest at the rate shown in the Federal Reserve statistical release closest to January 1 of each year for seven (7) year constant maturity treasuries plus sixty (60) basis points. The interest rate shall remain in effect for a one-year period. At such time as the Company seeks recovery of these expenses, any party may challenge the prudence of the level of such costs.
- 11. This Stipulation is the product of extensive negotiations by the Signatory Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Signatory

Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified and agreed to herein. The Signatory Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Signatory Parties have stipulated herein. The Signatory Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Signatory Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Signatory Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation. The Signatory Parties further agree that the purpose of this Stipulation is to reach fair and reasonable rates, and that it will avoid protracted and costly litigation of certain issues and that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Signatory Parties shall be prohibited from or prejudiced in arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter.

12. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are signatories of this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
