BY THE BOARD:

On March 16, 2012, Brian O'Connor (Petitioner) filed a petition with the Board of Public Utilities (Board) requesting a formal hearing related to a billing dispute with Public Service Electric and Gas Company (Respondent) for utility services rendered by Respondent.

Following receipt of Respondent's answer, the Board transmitted this matter to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for hearing and initial disposition as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 et seq. This matter was assigned to Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Kimberly A. Moss.

While this matter was pending at the OAL, the parties engaged in negotiations and signed a Stipulation of Settlement (Stipulation) that was submitted to the ALJ. The Stipulation states the parties intend to fully resolve this matter on the following terms:

- 1. Petitioner shall credit Petitioner's account \$750 for electric and gas service leaving an overdue balance of \$3,757.83.
- 2. To satisfy the remainder of the outstanding bill, Petitioner shall make seventeen monthly payments of \$209 and one monthly payment of \$204.83.

On January 4, 2013, ALJ Moss issued an Initial Decision, with the Stipulation attached for reference, finding that the Stipulation was voluntary, that its terms fully disposed of all issues in controversy and that it was consistent with law. Based on these findings, ALJ Moss concluded that the Stipulation satisfied the requirements of N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1.

Having reviewed the Initial Decision, the record, and the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by their signatures, that by the terms of the Stipulation fully resolved all outstanding contested issues in this matter, and the terms of the Stipulation are consistent with law.

Accordingly, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Initial Decision and the Stipulation of Settlement executed by the parties in their entirety as if fully set forth herein.

BEFORE KIMBERLY A. MOSS, ALJ:

On April 24, 2012, this matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for hearing as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to-15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F 1 to-13. A telephone prehearing was conducted on May 18, 2012 during which time the hearing was scheduled for August 1, 2012. The August 1, 2012 hearing was adjourned due an administrative error. The matter was rescheduled to August 2, 2012. During the pendency of the hearing the parties reached a settlement. On December 14, 2012 the undersigned received a copy of the executed Stipulation of Settlement, which is attached hereto for reference.

I have reviewed the record and terms of the Stipulation of Settlement and FIND:

1. The parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by the signatures of the parties or their representatives.

2. The settlement fully disposes of all issues in controversy and is consistent

with law.

I **CONCLUDE** that the agreement meets the requirements of <u>N.J.A.</u>C. 1:1-19.1 and therefore, it is **ORDERED** that the parties comply with the settlement terms and that

these proceedings be and are hereby concluded.

I hereby FILE my initial decision with the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES for

consideration.

On or about March 15, 2012 Petitioner filed the above-referenced billing dispute. Public Service Electric & Gas Company ("PSE&G" or "Respondent") filed an answer to Petitioner's petition and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("NJBPU" or "Board") transmitted the matter to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") as a contested case for adjudication.

In the interests of resolving this matter without further delay, extensive effort and cost, the parties hereto agreed to settle this matter in accordance with the following terms:

- PSE&G agrees to credit \$750.00 to Petitioner's account for electric and gas service to bring the outstanding overdue balance owed on the account to \$3,757.83. Petitioner will pay the remainder of the outstanding balance in 18 monthly installment payments. Petitioner will make seventeen (17) monthly payments of \$209.00 and one (1) monthly payment of \$204.83 towards the outstanding balance.
- This agreement is in settlement of the Petition filed by Petitioner on or about March 15, 2012.
- The undersigned agree that this Settlement contains mutually balancing and interdependent provisions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. In the event any particular aspect of this Settlement is not accepted and approved by the Board or modified by the Board, the party that is adversely affected by the modification can either accept the modification or declare this Settlement to be null and void, and the parties shall be placed in the same position that they were in immediately prior to its execution.
