#### BY THE BOARD:

South Jersey Gas Company ("SJG" or "Company"), a regulated utility subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities ("Board"), is a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey engaged in the business of transmission and distribution of natural gas to approximately 360,000 customers within its service territory.

SJG currently provides natural gas service within the Township of Fairfield ("Township") to approximately 571 residential and 26 commercial customers. The Company's consent to use the streets within the Township for the provision of gas service expired on October 8, 2002.1 pursuant to the fifty (50) year statutory limitation set forth in N.J.S.A. 48:3-15. On December 9. 2014, pursuant to Ordinance No. 9-2014, the Township renewed its consent and granted SJG continued permission to lay and construct its pipes, mains, and related appurtenances and facilities within the streets, alleys, squares and public places within the Township for a period of fifty (50) years to furnish gas service in the Township. By letter dated June 12, 2015, the Company accepted and agreed to the terms of the consent. Copies of the Ordinance and the letter of acceptance are attached to this Order as Exhibits "A" and "B" respectively.

On July 14, 2015, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-14 and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.5, SJG filed a petition requesting that the Board approve the consent adopted by the Township. As required by law

<sup>1</sup> The Board notes that municipal consents often expire some time prior to their renewal even when the Company initiates the renewal process prior to the expiration of the previous term. This is primarily the result of the time necessary for a municipality to fulfill the legal requirements that attend to all formal actions it must take along with the additional time for hearing and Board approval as required by law. The Board has been assured that pending review of its petition, SJG has continued to provide service to its customers within the Township in an uninterrupted manner.

and after notice, a hearing in this matter was held on September 28, 2015, William Agee, Esq., the Board's duly appointed hearing officer. Appearances were made on behalf of the Company, the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") and Board Staff. No other party participated in the hearing or filed any written submission with the Board related to this proceeding.

At the hearing, the Company relied on its petition and exhibits filed with the Board and presented the testimony of Joseph Schneider, its General Manager of System Engineering and Planning. Mr. Schneider testified that SJG is experiencing an increase in customers within its service territory due to conversion from other fuels to natural gas. According to the petition, SJG anticipates growth in its defined service territory to be approximately one (1) percent annually for the next three (3) to five (5) years. SJG further represents that it has the capacity to ensure continuation of its natural gas service and does not foresee any concerns regarding its ability to meet the existing and future demands of the Borough.

Rate Counsel, in its written comments to the petition dated November 5, 2015, indicated that it does not object to the Company's petition, and noted that the term of the municipal consent related to the use of streets is limited to fifty (50) years. However, Rate Counsel requests that approval of the petition include certain restrictions which are incorporated in this Order.

After a full review of the entire record, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the municipal consent for use of the streets, which is the subject of this matter, is necessary and proper for the public convenience and properly serves the public interest, and that SJG has the ability to continue to provide safe, adequate and proper service. The Board <u>FURTHER FINDS</u> that the Company has the necessary experience, financial capability, capacity, and facilities in the Township to continue to provide adequate and appropriate service to its existing customers, as well as expected future customers, and that the fifty (50) year duration of the municipal consent to use the streets is consistent with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 48:3-15. Accordingly, the Board, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 48:2-14, <u>HEREBY APPROVES</u> the consent granted to SJG by the Township to continue to provide gas service, and for the continued use of its public streets for that purpose for a period of fifty (50) years.

The approval granted hereinabove shall be subject to the following provisions:

- This Order shall not be construed as directly or indirectly fixing for any purposes whatsoever the value of any tangible or intangible assets now owned or hereafter to be owned by SJG.
- This Order shall not effect nor in any way limit the exercise of the authority of this Board of the State in any future petition or in any proceedings with respect to rates, franchises, services, financing, accounting, capitalization, depreciation, or in any other matters affecting SJG.

This Order shall be effective as of May 7, 2016.

ORDINANCE NO. 9 - 2014

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWED CONSENT AND PERMISSION TO THE SOUTH IERSBY GAS COMPANY, A CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF HEW IERSBY, TO FURNISH GAS POR LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER IN THE TOWNSHIP OF PAREFELD, COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, South Jersey Gas Company, a corporation of the State of New Jersey, provides natural gas service to the Township of Painfield pursuant to the municipal concent first granted to South Jersey Gas Company in Ordinance No. 71 - 1952 passed on October 7, 1952;

WHERBAS. Sooth Jersey Cas Company now seeks, pursuent to N.J.S.A. 48:3-15, the sontent of the Township of Feirfield to renew by adopting the fullowing Ordinance,

NOW, THERSPORD, 86 IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Pairtield, County of Competiand and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section I. That exclusive and perpetual consent and permission to furthly gar for light, heat and purpose in the Township of Fairfield, County of Cumberland and State of New Ierrey, is hereby given and graded to South Jersey Gas Company, a corporation of the State of New Jersey, subject to approval of such consent and cormission by the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey.

Section 2. That exclusive consent and permission is hereby given to South Jersey Gas Company to lay and construct its pipes and mains and related appartenences and facilities within the streets, afters, squares and public places within the Township of Fabricki in the manner required by R.S. 42:9-21, and subject to reasonable regulations imposed by ordinance or resolution with respect to the opening of streets and public places, subject to approved of such cannot end permission by the Soard of Public Utilities.

Section 3. • The consumts granted in Sections 1 and 2 are granted for the entire geographical area of the Township of Fairfield and extend to the boundaries of the Township of Fairfield.

Section 4. The said South Jersey Gas Company shall within thirty (30) days after the passage of this ordinance file with the Township Clerk a bond in the amount of as prescribed in the Code of the Township of Pairfield, conditioned upon the restoration of any street or public place which may be opened by it his manner satisfactory to the Township Engineer.

This ordinance shall take offect after its final passage and publication according to law. Section 5.
