BY THE BOARD:

On November 23, 2020, Rockland Electric Company ("RECO" or "Company") filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") seeking approval to invest approximately \$6.7 million over a five-year period for a comprehensive Electric Vehicle ("EV") Program, consisting of six EV subprograms applicable to light-duty vehicles ("Petition"). On October 12, 2022, the Board approved a stipulation that authorized RECO to invest approximately \$7.6 million in an EV Program. As part of the stipulation approved by the Board, RECO was required to file a residential managed charging program by December 31, 2022.

On December 20, 2022, RECO filed a petition with the Board seeking approval for a residential managed charging program ("Petition"). According to RECO, the residential managed charging program was designed to develop customer off-peak charging behavior, encourage EV charging at beneficial times, and lead to the development of positive charging habits to minimize the need for additional distribution system infrastructure to serve peak demand and improve the use of existing utility assets. The proposed program will cost approximately \$3,833,931 and will provide incentives to customers who enroll and participate in the Company's program after purchasing on the Company's online store a residential charger.

DISCUSSION

The Board has determined that RECO's Petition should be retained by the Board for hearing. Accordingly, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-32, the Board <u>HEREBY DESIGNATES</u> Commissioner Robert M. Gordon as the presiding commissioner with authority to rule on all motions that arise during the pendency of this proceeding and to modify any schedules that may be set as necessary to secure a just and expeditious determination of the Petition. Further, the Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> that any entity seeking to intervene or participate in this matter file the appropriate application with the Board by March 1, 2023. Any party wishing to file a motion for admission of counsel, <u>pro hac vice</u>, should do so concurrently with any motion to intervene or participate.

In addition, in compliance with the Board's Order in Docket No. EO20030254, all parties are <u>HEREBY DIRECTED</u> to serve all documents electronically.³ No hard copies shall be filed until the Board lifts the restrictions imposed in that Order. The Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> Staff to post this Order to the Board's website.
