# BY THE BOARD:1

On January 19, 2024, New Jersey-American Water Company, Inc. ("NJAWC" or "Company") filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") seeking approval of an increase in its base rates for water and wastewater service of approximately \$161.7 million, or 16.89%, for services rendered on and after February 21, 2024 ("Petition").

NJAWC is engaged in the production, treatment, and distribution of water and collection of wastewater within its defined service territory within the State of New Jersey. The Company's service territory includes portions of: Atlantic, Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Essex, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, Salem, Somerset, Union, and Warren counties. As of December 31, 2023, the Company provides service

to approximately 668,000 water and fire service customers and 64,200 wastewater service customers.

According to the Petition, the primary driver of the proposed rate increase is the Company's capital investment to maintain and improve infrastructure and continue to provide safe, reliable, and adequate service to its customers.

The Company asserted that, in addition to operations and maintenance expenses driven by recent high levels of inflation and supply chain disruptions, its cost of capital increased due to the rise in interest rates driven by the Federal Reserve Board.

By Order dated February 14, 2024, the Board suspended the proposed rates until June 21, 2024.<sup>2</sup> The Board subsequently transmitted this matter to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") for hearing as a contested case where it was assigned to Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Tricia M. Caliguire.

Middlesex Water Company, Johanna Foods, Inc., Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, Cogen Technologies Linden Venture, L.P., the Trustees of Princeton University, and the Mount Laurel Township Municipal Utilities Authority filed Motions to Intervene in this matter. All motions were unopposed and granted by ALJ Caliguire.

On April 23, 2024, and supplemented on May 3, 2024, NJAWC updated the Petition to include nine (9) months of actual, and three (3) of estimated information ("9+3 Update"). Based upon the 9+3 Update, NJAWC updated its proposed revenue requirement to an increase of \$165.7 million.

Because a review of this matter will not be complete before June 21, 2024, and the proposed revisions, if approved, will likely increase existing rates and change or alter existing classifications in NJAWC's tariff, it is **HEREBY ORDERED** as follows:

- (1) Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21(d), and consistent with N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12, the proposed revisions are further suspended until October 21, 2024, unless prior to that date the Board makes a determination disposing of the Petition or enters an Order further suspending the proposed revisions;
- (2) NJAWC shall, at least 10 days prior to the date set for hearing on the Petition by the OAL, file with this Board, and with the OAL, proof of compliance with the notice provisions of N.J.S.A. 48:2-32.2 and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12(b) and (c), which notice shall include a statement that any relief found by the Board to be just and reasonable may be allocated by the Board to any class or classes of customers on any rate or schedule as the Board may determine; and
- (3) NJAWC shall serve copies of this Order upon the OAL, the Division of Rate Counsel (140 East Front Street, 4th Floor, Post Office Box 003, Trenton, N.J. 08625), the clerk of each affected municipality, the clerk of the Boards of County Commissioners of each affected county, and, where appropriate, the executive officer of the affected county within its service area. Proof of service of this Order shall be filed with the Board.
