

NOTICE TO PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMPANY ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS

In the Matter of the Petition of Public Service Electric and Gas Company for Approval of Electric Base Rate Adjustments Pursuant to the Clean Energy Future- Electric Vehicle (“CEF-EV”) Program

Notice of Filing and Notice of Public Hearings

BPU Docket No. ER25100568

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that, on October 15, 2025, Public Service Electric and Gas Company (“PSE&G” or “Company”) filed a petition and supporting documentation with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (“Board” or “BPU”) seeking Board approval for cost recovery associated with its Clean Energy Future-Electric Vehicle Program (“CEF-EV” or “Program”) (“Petition”).

By Order dated January 27, 2021, in Docket No. EO18101111, the Board approved the Company’s CEF-EV Program (“CEF-EV Program Order”). The CEF-EV Program Order authorized the Company to invest up to \$166.2 million in facilities associated with its CEF-EV programs and to incur up to \$39 million of incremental operation and maintenance (“O&M”) expenses, including administrative costs incurred to support the programs. By Order dated October 9, 2024, the Board issued an Order in PSE&G’s 2023 Rate Case proceeding whereby the Board directed that the rate case proceeding be held open so that CEF-EV investment placed in service more than six (6) months after the test year be reviewed and placed into rates through annual rate adjustment filings.

By the Petition, PSE&G seeks Board approval to recover an estimated annual revenue increase of approximately \$9.243 million from the Company’s electric customers associated with actual CEF-EV investment costs incurred through September 30, 2025, and forecasted costs through December 31, 2025.

On January 21, 2026, the Company filed an update to its filing providing actual data through October 31, 2025, including recalculated rates based on such data. As a result of this update, the Company is seeking approval to recover an estimated annual revenue increase of approximately \$8.1 million from the Company’s electric customers.

For illustrative purposes, the estimated CEF-EV charges effective April 1, 2026, including New Jersey Sales and Use Tax (“SUT”) for Residential Rate Schedule RS, are shown in Table #1.

Table #2 provides customers with the approximate impact of the proposed increase in rates relating to CEF-EV, if approved by the Board, effective April 1, 2026. The annual percentage increase applicable to specific customers will vary according to the applicable rate schedule and the level of the customer’s usage.

Under the Company’s proposal, a typical residential electric customer using 683 kilowatt-hours (“kWh”) in a summer month and 558 kWh in an average month, or 6,700 kWh annually, would see an increase in their average monthly bill from \$157.97 to \$158.20, or \$0.23, approximately 0.2%. The approximate effect of the proposed increase on typical electric residential monthly bills, if approved by the Board, is illustrated in Table #3 below.

Any rate adjustments with resulting changes in bill impacts found by the Board to be just and reasonable as the result of the Company’s Petition may be modified and/or allocated by the Board in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and for other good and legally sufficient reasons to any class or classes of customers of the Company. Therefore, the described charges may increase, or decrease based upon the Board’s decision. PSE&G’s electric costs addressed in the Petition and subsequent updates will remain subject to audit by the Board, and Board approval shall not preclude or prohibit the Board from taking any such actions deemed appropriate as a result of any such audit.

A copy of this Notice of Filing and Public Hearings on the Petition is being served upon the clerk, executive or administrator of each municipality and county within the Company’s service territory. The Petition is available for review online at the PSEG website at <http://www.pseg.com/pseandgfilings> and has

also been sent to the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel (“Rate Counsel”), who will represent the interests of all PSE&G customers in this proceeding.
