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A meter will be considered accurate when it does not show an average error greater than plus or minus 2%, when compared with standards approved by the Board. The accuracy of the meter shall be determined by taking the average of percentage registration at light load and at heavy load, giving the heavy load registration a weight of four. **NOTE: DO NOT** allow the company to remove the meter until you receive further written/email instruction from Board staff. You cannot file this application if the meter has been removed by the company, since the Board did not have control of the meter, the Board cannot certify the accuracy of the meter. Upon application by any customer to the Board, a test of the meter will be witnessed by Board staff. Such test shall be made as soon as practicable after receipt of the application and upon notice to the customer and the utility as to the time, date and place of testing.
